



The Board of Trustees met June 6-7 with several orders of business. The Executive Director's contract was renewed by a unanimous vote. District representatives reviewed activities in each district and all districts confirmed that they would participate in and hold a district meeting at the WCOI6 meeting in 2004. The Southern District noted that it will return to holding a separate annual meeting in 2005.

The Executive Director reported on the guidelines that are designed to prevent date conflicts of district meetings that he had developed in response to the Board's request. This was done to facilitate the meeting planning process and increase attendance at district meetings.

Dr. Recker reported on issues related to the arbitration action and the California and Florida activities.

The Board reviewed the information of the 2003 Annual Meeting. Dr. Mills is encouraging Academy members to invite referring doctors and other colleagues to the meeting. He hopes to see a substantial increase in the number of attendees, demonstrating our strength as an organization. The Board also reviewed the activities related to the upcoming meetings in 2004 and 2005.

Dr. LaMar reviewed the Treasurer's report and noted that the Academy had once again received an unqualified annual audit. In addition, the April 30 financial statements were reviewed.

Mr. Shuck reported that the Academy has continued to strengthen its financial position and reserves, conduct advance planning activities among the Officers and with the Annual Meeting committees, conduct new educational courses, maintain a stable staffing pattern and see an increase in the overall membership and number of credentialed members. To reinforce these successes, the Board established an ad hoc Audit and Finance Committee to provide oversight of the budget development process; analyze investment performance and recommend adjustments; review the annual financial report, the annual audit, and the internal financial controls; and provide advice to the Treasurer. The Board authorized the President and Executive Director to appoint the following individuals to the new committee: the treasurer, as chairman; one other officer; and a non-board mem-

The Board reviewed the information about candidates who completed the Associate Fellow and Fellow examinations at the 2003 A & C Board meeting. The Board of Trustees accepted the recommendations of the A & C Board and elected the members to the designated membership category.

The Board approved the following nominations by the Global committee for: advisors — Drs. Burt Balkin, Enrique Rivera, Sidney Berger, and Mira Yasinovsky; delegates —Drs Manuel Chanavaz, John Stowell, and Gong Ping.

Following discussion, the Board approved the committee's recommendation that Global Committee members be appointed for one-year terms, subject to renewal by the Board based on performance and that the committee's award be named, "Global Implant Dentist of the Year" and that the award recipient be recommended by the committee and approved by the Board.

The Board reminds credentialed members that they can establish a link between the Academy's web site and the member's web site.

The Marketing committee has developed a reference statement or tag line of "AAID, advancing the standard of care for comprehensive implant dentistry since 1951" that can be used to differentiate the Academy from other implant organizations. Following discussion, the Board agreed to have the Marketing Committee review materials developed by the districts and the Academy. The Board asked the committee to prepare templates for district meeting marketing material.

The Life Member application for Dr. Motohiro Nakato was approved. In addition, current membership numbers were reviewed and it was noted that the Academy's membership continues to grow.

Dr. Johnson noted that the Nominating committee recommends that a separate ad hoc committee be established that would assume the responsibility to recommend leadership training activities for district and national leaders. Dr. Mills agreed to consider how to implement this recommendation.

The Board received reports from the Publications, Site Selection, Study Club, Auxiliary CE committees.

The Board ratified the appointment of Dr. Patrick Ferrillo, Jr. and Gisela Landreville to the Research Foundation's Board of Directors

Dr. Svoboda presented his report on developing an AAID Speakers' Guild. The Board appointed Dr. Svoboda as the chairman of a committee to develop and implement an AAID Speakers' Guild.

The meeting adjourned and then held a session to begin development of a strategic planning process for the Academy.

Marketing Dental Implants Course Scheduled November 9

If you have questions about how to offer implants as a treatment option and how to increase their acceptance in your practice, **Craig Cooper, DDS,** has answers. Plan to attend the course that will be presented at the Diplomat Hotel on Sunday, November 9, from 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 noon.

ADMISSIONS AND CREDENTIALS BOARD

February 1 is the application deadline for the 2004 oral/case examinations for Associate Fellow and Fellow membership, which will be held in Chicago , April 29 - May 2. If you passed the written part of the two-part Associate Fellowship examination in 2001, this is the last time that the oral/case examination will be given during your three-year eligibility period.

If you are a general member of the AAID, make 2004 the year that you begin the two-part (written and oral/case) process to become an Associate Fellow. Candidates must pass the written part before applying for the oral/case examination, and both parts of the examination must be completed successfully within three years.

The written part of the Associate Fellow examination will be given at the following times and places during 2004: June 13,Ne wYork City;August 6, Chicago and November 7, NewYork City, in conjunction with the 2004 Annual meeting. The date of the written exam that will be given in Atlanta at the end of the 2004 MCG MaxiCourse® will be announced later.

Applications and the \$600 application fee are due in the Headquarters Office 30 days before the examination date.





I graduated from dental school in Colombia, South America, in 1995 and started a private practice in Armenia Colombia. She can properly masticate and digest her food.

I have joined my brothers and sisters in helping our family survive and prosper. I believe that I can fulfill my lifelong goal of taking care of others and c hanging lives.


PAST PRESIDENT BRINGS HOME THE GOLD... AND THE SILVER

PAST PRESIDENT GOES TO THE DOGS




