

TWO NEW SUITS FILED BY AAID

On behalf of its credentialed members and ABOI Diplomates, the Academy has filed two new suits to protect the rights of members to announce their earned credentials. It's important to understand where the AAID has been and where it's going with its legal pursuits.

What are the battles all about?

Simply stated, many dentists who have not earned a bona fide credential do not want their potential competitors to have a market place advantage or to appear more qualified to the general public. The advertising of credentials in non-specialty areas such as implant dentistry could place a dental competitor at an economic disadvantage. Prohibitions/restrictions on such advertising are an effective way, albeit potentially unlawful, to level the playing field. Organized dentistry (ADA and its components and constituents) supports and promotes such restrictions on advertising on the alleged basis of 'protecting' consumers from being confused or misled, even though there are no credible scientifically based studies that actually demonstrate any harm to consumers as a result of such advertising.

Why the lawsuits?

When states enact dental advertising restrictions or prohibitions through statute or regulations at the behest of a state dental organization, a dentist in that state is subject to disciplinary action for any subsequent violation. Since 1994, and on behalf of its members, the Academy has fought to remove various state prohibitions against credentialed members' advertising/announcing their hard-earned credentials, including restrictions that impose cumbersome and lengthy disclaimers in any such advertising. The Academy believes that burdensome disclaimers are virtually the same

 as complete prohibitions but does not object to reasonable disclaimers such as 'general dentist.'

What are the approved ADA specialties and what do they have to do with restrictions on the advertising of our credentials?

The ADA recognizes oral and maxillofacial surgery, prosthodontics, periodontics, oral and maxillofacial radiology, oral pathology, dental public health, endodontics, orthodontics and dentalfacial orthopedics and pediatric dentistry as specialties. To date, the American Dental Association (ADA) has not recognized implant dentistry as a specialty. However, since 1996, three dental specialties have amended their respective practice areas to specifically include implant dentistry: oral and maxillofacial surgery; prosthodontics and periodontics. Accordingly, those specialties believe that they are the experts in implant dentistry; AAID and ABOI/ ID credentials risk a challenge to that perception.

Why does the ADA not recognize implant dentistry as a specialty?

Despite formal applications to the ADA that are ultimately determined by the politics of the ADA House of Delegates, the ADA has denied the AAID's request to recognize implant dentistry as a specialty. That doesn't seem too difficult to understand when you consider that the applicant (AAID) is required to demonstrate to the ADA's satisfaction that the proposed area of specialty cannot be 'subsumed' by existing dental specialties. Turf wars and economics will likely prevent implant dentistry from becoming a recognized dental specialty, at least as long as the ADA controls such determinations.

Why is advertising your credentials important?

The Commission on Dental Accreditation, the only entity recognized by the US Dept. of Education for *continued on page 13*

BOARD REPORT



The Board of Trustees met at the Westin Diplomat Resort & Spa in Hollywood, Florida, February 6-8, site of the 2003 Annual Meeting.

The first item for discussion was how to increase submissions to the Journal of Oral Implantology. Our members are a vast resource of clinical experience, but fail to share this through our Academy publication. By publishing clinical reports, research, literature reviews, prospective and retrospective studies, we can make a greater impact on the art and science of implant dentistry. It is very important to add to the professional literature with topics that we feel are important and to create a literature base for topics which are underrepresented in the literature, such as multimodal techniques. All members are encouraged to accept the challenge of preparing an article this year.

The district representatives presented their reports and the Board directed that all proposed District meeting dates be provided to the Executive Director for approval prior to any commitments to prevent conflicts.

Dr. Recker discussed activities in California and Florida and what we could do in response. The Board allocated funds for a federal court suit in California to have our previous victory enforced and a state court suit in Florida to establish our right to advertise our bona fide credentials. Activities relating to the 2002-05 Annual Meetings were reviewed that continue to build on the successes of the past for future meetings. Locations for future meetings are: 2003, Hollywood, FL; 2004, NewYork; 2005, Phoenix and 2006, Chicago.

Committee reports were presented. Dr. LaMar presented the progress of our Global program to date and the courses presented and planned. Six new Global delegates were approved: Paul Coulthard, United Kingdon; John Giblin, Australia; Mario Groisman, Brazil; Jorge A. Jorge, Brazil; Nicholas Mahon, Ireland; andTorTegander, Norway. Drs. Thomas Chess, Jaime Lozada, and Louis Rigali were approved as Global Advisors.

A MaxiCourse[®] is being developed for India by Dr. Charles Weiss. This will be a great opportunity to help fulfill our mission of education. (see p. 10)

Congratulations to Dr. Valentine Block, Dr. Irving Kaplan, Dr. Richard Miller and Dr. Louis Naman who were elected to Life Membership.

The 2002 year-end financial statements were reviewed and approved and the surplus was transferred to the reserve fund.



THE ADA LETTER & THE PRESIDENT'S RESPONSE

ADA NEWS JANUARY 6, 2003

Implant dentistry

I was perusing the front page of the Sept. 2 ADA News when I came upon the brief on "Implant Course." This course is a daylong implant surgical training course "designed to teach dentists the introductory skills needed for implant surgery." As a board-certified oral and maxillofacial surgeon, this raises serious concerns I have for the public's welfare. In my professional opinion, implant surgery should be performed by oral and maxillofacial surgeons and periodontists alone.

These are the only two specialties of dentistry in which surgical skills are taught under supervision as well as dealing with any complications that may possibly arise. I find it insulting to think that through a weekend course, general dentists and prosthodontists, who have had no surgical experience other than the minimal tooth extraction qualifications in ADA-accredited dental schools, feel they can properly manage these surgical techniques.

There is a reason that dental implants have had such a high success rate when being placed. Up until this point, placing them have been surgeons trained in periodontics, which is a two- to threeyear residency, or an oral and maxillofacial surgeon who has spent four to six years of surgical training. The reason that implant placement appears to be easy is that skilled surgeons have been providing these services.

I realize that the implant companies have been targeting the general practitioner by offering these courses. The representatives of these companies surely are not surgeons and their obligation is to increase the revenue of their companies by getting as many implants placed as possible.

Unfortunately, the conclusions that come to mind if unqualified doctors acting as surgeons are not good. In my opinion, the success rates will significantly decrease and with that, word of mouth will spread among the public and the acceptance for treatment will also decrease and finally, inevitably, a few people will get hurt in the process. Let us not forget that when we perform certain procedures we are all held to a certain standard of care. Even the best-trained surgeons will have complications at times. Think about what you will say if you are sitting in a courtroom and the prosecuting attorney is asking what your qualifications are to perform this surgery. Will your answer be the weekend course, or can it be backed up by several years of surgical training under close supervision in a residency followed by board certification in your field?

As a side note, I can appreciate the desire to expand one's scope of practice. For me, as an extension of my facial trauma experience, I am interested in facial cosmetic surgery. Rather than taking numerous weekend courses that even may include cadaveric dissection, I have chosen to take the path of leaving my private practice after five years and returning for a year-long fellowship in this area.

Editor's note: According to the ADA Council on Dental Education and Licensure, implant dentistry may fall within the scope of practice of the appropriately trained general dentist. Additionally, in accordance with the ADAapproved definitions and the Commission on Dental Accreditation's advanced specialty education program standards, implant dentistry falls within the scope of practice of the following dental specialties: prosthodontics, periodontics and oral and maxillofacial surgery.

Dear Ms. Jakush:

Thankfully, the Editor's note following Dr. Haigney's letter published in the January 6 edition of the ADA News corrects his misrepresentation that only oral surgeons and periodontists should place implants.

The American Academy of Implant Dentistry is the oldest professional organization in the world dedicated to the advancement of implant dentistry. Its members are comprised of general dentists as well as specialists who share a common purpose excellence in implant dentistry. The Academy has been on the forefront of helping dentists achieve this excellence and the success rates Dr. Haigney cites. In fact, it sponsors comprehensive implant education courses that include over 300 hours of instruction. Many of the participants are periodontists, prosthodontists and oral and maxillofacial surgeons who recognize that they did not receive adequate implant training in their graduate-level programs.

Formal training in a clinical skill as advocated by Dr. Haigney is but one method of gaining expertise. The dental profession has a long and proud history of encouraging life-long learning via continuing education sponsored by organizations, schools and manufacturers. Dr. Haigney is to be commended for his pursuit of excellence through formal education programs; however, he and others should not cast aspersions on dentists who elect to enhance their expertise through other means. For most practitioners, including oral and maxillofacial surgeons, going back to school on a full-time basis is not a practical option.

The Academy's founders, who helped develop the field of implant dentistry, saw the need for the profession to learn about this new treatment option and began offering educational opportunities to others. The current Academy members continue this legacy and extend a welcoming hand to any dentist who wants to enhance his or her skills. Sincerely,

AAID First International 300 hour MaxiCourse[®] to be Held in India

Previously appointed by vote of the Trustees as course director for the proposed course in India, Dr. Charles M. Weiss was charged with the preparation of a curriculum and faculty selection for submission to the Education Committee.

Dr. Shankar Iyer, vice-president of the NE District of AAID, was appointed course codirector. Primarily through the dedication of Dr. Iyer, who recently completed a three-year graduate education program in prosthodontics at NYU College of Dentistry, a unique exciting case-based teaching curriculum was developed. Curriculum vitaes from a broad base of AAID credentialed potential faculty were gathered, and together with the curriculum, presented to the Education Committee. They gave the "go ahead" for the course, requesting that final faculty selection and their subjects of instruction be submitted to them in advance. Constant monitoring and course evaluation for each Module along the way will be done.

Our co-sponsor in India is the Indian Academy of Interdisciplinary Dentistry (IAID) under the leadership of Dr. C.V.N Rao. Dr. Weiss went to India to help celebrate the promotional launching of the course. Dr. R.K. Bali, President of the Dental Council of India accepted appointment as Chairman of the Advisory Board to the AAID MaxiCourse[®] in India.

It is noteworthy that the Dental Council of India is the national governmental licensing agency for all dentists in the country, as well as the agency charged with the accreditation of each of the 173 dental schools whose graduates, following licensing, serve the population of more than one billion people. The acceptance of this appointment by Dr. Bali represents our commitment to compliance with the regulations that apply. Both the AAID and IAID are honored by Dr. Bali's support of our efforts.


The course directors are committed to case-based teaching in a logical orderly format. The course is divided into six modules, each of five days, for 10 hours a day, summing up to the required 300 hours.

The dates of each module have been selected, starting in August 2003, and ending in early February 2004. The course directors therefore know the exact date, in advance, that each area of the curriculum will be taught. Faculty thus will not only be invited to teach the subjects of their greatest expertise, but will be aware of their teaching dates in advance. This will assure that there will be no conflicts of faculty time commitments. In that way an orderly flow of information will be preserved.

The Trustees directed that course reports be passed through our Executive Director for transmittal to all concerned officers and committees. When our first International MaxiCourse[®] is a success, it is expected to be repeated throughout the world. The recognition and goodwill that will accrue to our Academy can be significant. 

the accreditation of dental schools, does not require dental schools to include surgical placement or restoration of dental implants in the curriculum, or require that dental students ever place one implant during the course of their studies! Obviously, because dentists routinely graduate with little or no experience in implant dentistry-the norm for over fifty years-dental consumers would benefit from access to verifiable information related to a dentist's education, experience and testing relative to implant dental services. Without the ability to advertise bona fide credentials in implant dentistry, the public is placed in an information vacuum and only exposed to dental advertisements offering implant dental services, regardless of that dentist's actual training and experience in implant dentistry, or lack thereof.

So why the Florida and California lawsuits?

In 1996 the ADA began a campaign to encourage state boards to impose restrictions on the advertising of credentials in non-specialty areas of dentistry. When Florida did an about face in 1996 at the behest of the Florida Dental Association (after the Florida Board had expressly declared in 1994 that AAID and ABOI/ID credentials were bona fide and could lawfully be advertised) and passed legislation banning the advertisement of any credential other than those in the recognized dental specialties, a court challenge was the only option available to protect AAID member dentists. Shortly thereafter, California enacted similar legislation and court battles commenced in both states.

Status of Current AAID Lawsuits California:

1997—What has come to be known as Bingham I, suit was filed against the California Department of Consumer Affairs and California Dental Board of Examiners as a result of their developing regulations to prohibit the advertising of AAID credentials.

1998-the case was dismissed as the Court concluded that the AAID must first seek a decision from the Board of Dental Examiners (BDE) as to whether or not Dr. Bingham could advertise his AAID and ABOI/ID credentials. After the Board failed to respond to the AAID's request, a second suit was filed (Bingham II).

2000-The Bingham II decision was issued, in which the federal court struck down as unconstitutional California's prohibition against dentists advertising credentials awarded by the AAID and ABOI/ID. The advertisement of these credentials "constitutes commercial speech protected under the First Amendment," said U.S.

District Judge David F. Levi. The Court held that "the AAID is a bona fide organization that issues credentials according to certain published standards."

2002-The California Dental Association has statute amended in September 2002, attempting to legislatively overrule the decision of the federal court in Bingham II.

2003 - The AAID and Dr. Michael Potts file suit in February to have statute declared unconstitutional based on the decision in Bingham II.

Florida

1996-a Florida statute prohibited the advertisement by a dentist of any credential other than those obtained by an ADA recognized credentialing entity, i.e., an ADA recognized dental specialty.

1998- the U.S. District Court in Tallahassee, granted summary judgment to the AAID and Dr. Richard Borgner (Borgner I), holding that the Florida statute violated the First Amendment right to free commercial speech and handed down a ruling that set a critical precedent to protect the rights of AAID and ABOI/ID credentialed members to advertise their credentials in Florida. 1999-Florida Dental Association has statute amended to ostensibly allow advertising of AAID and ABOI/ID credentials, but conditioned on the inclusion of lengthy and onerous disclaimers that, from a practical perspective, essentially prohibit the advertising.

2000—AAID and Dr. Borgner again file suit, challenging new amended statute.

2001—Federal district court issues Borgner II, holding that the new statute is just as unconstitutional as the statute struck down in Borgner I.

2001—Florida Board of Dentistry appeals district court decision to 11th Circuit Court of Appeals. 2002-In March, decision overturned by Eleventh Circuit Court of Appeals in a 2/1 split decision. 2002—AAID and Dr. Borgner appeal Eleventh Circuit's decision to the United States Supreme Court.

2002—In December the United States Supreme Court denied the AAID's request to review the case, but issued a rare dissenting opinion by Justices Thomas and Ginsburg, arguing that the case should be reviewed by the Supreme Court since it "... presents an excellent opportunity to clarify some oft-recurring issues in the First Amendment treatment of commercial speech and to provide lower courts with guidance on ... statemandated disclaimers."

2003 — The AAID and Dr. Francis DuCoin and Dr. Lawrence Duffy file suit in March to have statute declared unconstitutional.

When will this end?

The new cases continue the Academy's efforts to protect its members' rights to announce their hard earned credentials. No other implant organization has been willing to challenge the system to such an extent. The AAID leaders believe the current twopronged approach will help resolve the issue and permanently establish the standard that AAID and ABOI/ID credentials are worthy of First Amendment protection. Stay tuned.....
