Federal Affairs Liason: October Update

Government Shutdown and Appropriations: The federal government shutdown has reached its fourth week, with no deal in sight. Key pressure points include the first missed paychecks for air traffic controllers, the expiration of SNAP benefits for over 41 million Americans, and the start of ACA Marketplace open enrollment with rising premiums. A new continuing resolution (CR) will be needed before the current one expires on November 21, and it's unclear whether Congress will pass a short- or

long-term measure.

Education Department Workforce Reductions and IDEA Programs:

- The reductions in force (RIF) within the Department of Education so far has eliminated more than half the positions at the Department, including nearly all positions in the Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services (OSERS). This has created significant disruption in administering the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) programs, leaving states uncertain about continued implementation and compliance. Federal funding currently covers around 14.7% of funds, far below the 40% commitment made when the law was enacted, creating a shortfall estimated at \$24-38 billion for the 2024-2025 school year. Funding for FY2024 and 2025 were maintained through a CR, but future funding is uncertain.
- On September 22, 2025, APTA joined in a letter drafted by the Council of Parent Attorneys and Advocates (COPAA) and the Council of Administrators of Special Education (CASE) urging the Secretary of the Department of Education to maintain all current grants under Part D of IDEA.
- On October 22, 2025, APTA joined with over 400 provider and patient groups in a joint statement expressing opposition to the U.S. Department of Education's recent RIF. These actions have conflict with specific requirements under IDEA and the Rehabilitation Act.
- On October 23, 2025, APTA joined with over 60 patient and provider organizations in a letter to the Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pensions Committee (HELP) with a request that the committee conduct an oversight hearing on the RIF actions of the Department of Education.

Federal Student Loan Caps:

- The Department of Education's Reimagining and Improving Student Education (RISE) Committee has begun discussions surrounding the definition of a "professional degree" versus "graduate degree" as it relates to federal student loan borrowing caps. Under current federal statute, only a limited number of degree programs such as medicine and dentistry are explicitly designated as professional degrees. Many others, including physical therapy, occupational therapy, and speech-language pathology, are not explicitly listed in statute. However, the statute allows the Department to recognize additional degree programs not explicitly listed.
- Although physical therapy is not explicitly named in federal statute, it has
 historically been treated as a professional degree. The current rulemaking
 process will determine whether any degrees if any should be formally added
 to the professional degree category through rulemaking by the Department. If
 the Doctor of Physical Therapy degree is recognized as a professional degree,
 students may borrow up to \$50,000 annually, with a lifetime cap of \$200,000. If
 not, borrowing is limited to \$20,500 per year, with a lifetime cap of \$100,000.
- APTA is collaborating with other affected health care provider groups and coalitions, including the Federation of Associations of Schools of the Health Professions (FASHP). As part of the rulemaking process, APTA recently submitted formal comments to the Department of Education advocating for the recognition of physical therapy as a professional degree. APTA also joined a health care provider coalition letter to the Department, while FASHP submitted an additional comment letter requesting a meeting with Department staff.
- The committee's next session is scheduled for November 3–7, 2025. The negotiated rulemaking process is expected to result in
