Officer reports

- Chair Sara
 - Welcomed Raine Osborne (leads the research collaborative) to the Scholarly Research Committee Chair since Yvonne Body stepped down as Scholarly/Research Committee Chair.
 - No new podcast has been done but discussions are ongoing about next guest.
 - We have our first recipient for the Excellence in Mentoring award which will be given at the APTE business meeting. Joanne Walker.
- Vice Chair Jason Zafereo

Committee Reports

- Nominating Committee Sara Kraft for David Gillette
 - We do have a candidate slated for each position. Will open nominations from the floor at APTE meeting,
- Program Committee Sara Kraft to update on rolls
 - APTA booth does not have a lot of volunteers and APTE needs moderators as well to help with rooms.
 - Christina will send the link to the volunteer positions out in newsletter to SIG. Sara will confirm who it should go out to.
 - No new information on roles for program chairs
- Scholarly/Research Raine Osborne
 - Overview: R/F research collaborative has been meeting since 2018 with a focus on larger scale R/F research across programs. Model for recommendations in RF research and a collaborative group that works across programs.
 - They have submitted a proposal to learn what is needed to do research across programs. They were awarded \$15,990 for the grant proposal.
 - Based off of the Excellence in PT Education Model (Jensen, et al): How does the model fit with RF education?
 - Do we need to make revisions to the model or are there things people are doing in R/F Education that demonstrate excellence in education?
 - What is the value of PT residency to stakeholders?
 - Starting in the Spring.
 - There is a process to select programs to join the research study. Hoping it will be a good platform to generate more questions and projects.
 - Value of residency education was presented at ELC and CSM. Panel discussion from the perspective of different stakeholders in residency and fellowship. Invite those that are looking into getting into residency or starting programs to come to the session.
 - Research from Matt Briggs on the value on R/F education from employer perspective. Raine Osborne: coming soon in PTJ looking at motivation for PT Residency education among various stakeholders.
 - What is the need and/or opportunity for this SIG to disseminate or generate research? From communications: we would like to expand this section. If you would like to see something different please let Christina know.
 - Can we use the SIG as a platform for RF research? This sig is well positioned to do that since we cross
 multiple disciplines. How should we use the website or membership to facilitate further research? Use this
 opportunity to disseminate the work and allow for research collaboration. Being involved would be
 interesting but daunting so collaboration, support, guidance, and mentorship would be helpful to advance
 the work of the committee.
 - What is the focus of the role in this SIG: Research <u>on</u> RF education process and/or research <u>from</u> residents and fellows (student led giving guidance or help to generate or disseminate that research)?
 - It is hard to get residents' research accepted from the academy side. Could our SIG help individuals get to the Brooks symposium by highlighting, encouraging or financially supporting attendance to the symposium? It could highlight the value of our SIG.
 - We have a lot of time invested in the Think Tank: tying those together between residencies and TT and HUB to create a more definitive research platform for residents and programs would be helpful.
 - Academy of PT Education strategic initiatives is to increase membership from clinicians as educators and engaging residents who are clinicians would fall in line with the APTE initiative.

- Perhaps we can get more people to ELC by finding sponsorship for posters geared toward R/F education. It would foster more participation at ELC and allow students or researchers more visibility. Great use of SIG funds.
- Can we collect case studies and publish a mini journal from Residency/Fellows? There would need to be a lot of people involved to put something like that together. Further discussion in future would be beneficial.
- CSM would be a great area to get volunteers for a research initiative in the future.
