Featured R/F Research

An orthopedic manual physical therapy fellowship training's impact on professional development, involvement, personal lives, and income — A survey study.

Introduction: Little research exists investigating the personal and professional outcomes of postprofessional physical therapy (PT) training. Therefore, the purpose of the current descriptive, web-based survey study was to determine self-reported outcomes from a postprofessional PT fellowship program, including graduate professional, educational, and research involvement; perceptions of the impact of training on clinical and professional attributes; changes in employment and income; and barriers to training.

Methods: Graduates of a part-time, hybrid-model, multisite orthopedic manual PT fellowship program were invited to complete the web-based survey. Descriptive data analyses were performed for all quantitative data, and responses to questions were analyzed and categorized into themes.

Results: Of the 77 fellowship graduates, 75 (97%) completed the survey. Graduates were involved in teaching; 43% (32/75) filled lead instructor roles in PT education programs. Further, 75% (57/75) were involved in research. The mean (SD) and median (range) increase in annual gross income was \$9560 (\$17,545) and \$2500 (\$0-\$125,000), respectively. Perceived areas with the largest impact of training included clinical reasoning, patient-centered and evidence-based practice, and professionalism. Life balance and family commitments were frequent barriers during training. **Discussion:** Graduates noted substantial perceived professional, clinical, and financial benefits to fellowship training. Limitations included lack of a control group and surveying participants from a single program. Future research should determine the influence that program and participant-related factors have on personal and professional lives of graduates and on clinical outcomes

Pediatric Residency & Fellowship SIG — APTA Academy of Pediatric Physical Therapy

Updates from the RF SIG meeting on April 7, 2021:

- The APTA Pediatric RF SIG represents members from 26 accredited and 3 developing programs, as well as any other members of APTA Pediatrics (students and professionals). Actions taken at the most recent ABPTRFE meeting included:
- Programs receiving Candidacy status
 - Mary Free Bed Rehabilitation Pediatric Residency
- Programs receiving Re-accreditation status
 - Pediatric Residency at Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital
 - The Johns Hopkins Hospital and George Washington University Pediatric Residency

Twenty accredited programs participated in our annual uniform announcement process and will be accepting our 2021-2022 cohort over the next few months. Our consortium continues to grow its content to help support newly developing and accredited programs with quality structured learning modules. The consortium will add an additional 7 modules to the existing 7 modules offered annually. The resident led journal club meets quarterly (west and east coast groups) to discuss current, evidence-based studies and the application of findings to inform clinical practice.

Neurologic Residency & Fellowship SIG — APTA Academy of Neurologic Physical Therapy

We had great success in March with our Common Offer Date trial run. We received feedback that perhaps having a "date" might send the wrong message to potential applicants, knowing that if they were given a spot several days after that date, they would know they were not the first choice. Next year, we may visit the idea of doing a Common Offer Week instead.

This fall, we hope to have a webinar on Mentoring, with several experienced mentors in a round-table format answering tough questions about this challenge component of residency. Additionally, we plan to update our Residency Compendium, which is jam packed with didactic resources, templates for developing programs, forms for mentorship and clinical reasoning, etc.
