

Residency Education: Is It Now or Never?

A pandemic has disrupted every facet of life. Educators have scrambled to adapt what existed "pre-COVID," attempting to salvage plans while considering how to meet requirements that previously seemed important and essential. Both the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE) and the American Board of Physical Therapy Residency and Fellowship Education (ABPTRFE) modified criteria to support physical therapist professional education programs in maintaining accreditation criteria within institutions and clinical settings that had to alter their own inherent structures. Despite unimaginable challenges, both professional doctor of physical therapy (DPT) programs and postprofessional physical therapist residency programs (PRPs) continue to exist. However, a chasm between the two puts one at much higher risk of collapse.

Translating Research into Practice

Much has changed in the world and in physical therapist education since the APTA Combined Sections Meeting in Denver just one year ago. In their recent point of view paper, "Residency education: Is it now or never?", Hartley and colleagues point to this period of "forced discovery" as a call to action to redefine the continuum of physical therapist education and better prepare Doctors of Physical Therapy to meet societal needs in the 21st century and beyond. Central to this aim is an increased emphasis on the deep or conceptual learning that occurs in practice-based learning environments such as residency education. This paper also highlights the need for high quality educational research that not only investigates the value of residency and fellowship education, but also considers the progression of competency and adaptability across the full continuum of physical therapist professional and postprofessional education.

The Academy of Physical Therapy Education (APTE) Residency & Fellowship Education Special Interest Group (RFESIG) is working to answer this call. As a follow up to the 2020 Educational Leadership Conference presentation, *The Time is Now: A Call to Advance Residency and Fellowship Research*, the RFESIG will host a series of sessions that bring together residency and fellowship educators and educational researchers to further define critical research questions and develop studies that will inform this important conversation.
