Featured Leaders

Over the next several newsletters, RFESIG will highlight one or more R/F Sig leaders.



Jessica Bertram graduated with a Master's Degree in Physical Therapy from University of Missouri in 2006 and completed her Doctorate in Physical Therapy from Marymount University in 2009. She is currently a PhD candidate at Texas Women's University in Dallas and a Board-Certified Clinical Specialist in Oncologic Physical Therapy. Jessica was the founding Director for the Oncology Residency Program at Baylor Scott and White Institute for Rehabilitation and currently serves as a faculty mentor for the program. Jessica is actively involved in advocacy of the oncology specialty as the Chair of the APTA Oncology Residency SIG and as a research assistant for ReVital Cancer Rehabilitation.

The APTA Oncology Residency SIG is currently working to establish quarterly education sessions on unique topics in oncology rehabilitation. The education sessions aim to fill potential curriculum gaps across programs as well as provide a platform for residency programs (directors, mentors, and residents) to network and collaborate. Additionally, the Oncology Residency SIG is working to establish a network of oncology rehab researchers that are willing/ interested in collaborating with the residency programs to expand research efforts in the oncology rehabilitation specialty.



Missy Criss, PT, DPT, PhD. Missy is Associate Professor at Chatham University's DPT Program in Pittsburgh, PA, and a faculty member in the UPMC Rehabilitation Institute's Geriatric Physical Therapy Residency Program. The APTA-Geri RF SIG recently completed 2 short videos explaining WHY GERIATRIC PT AND WHY RESIDENCY? (https://aptageriatrics.org/sig/residency-fellowship-sig/). The SIG is also developing a webinar targeting those interested in applying to geriatric residency programs. We hope to launch this in October when residency applications open, and we hope to include current residents and residency faculty/directors to answer questions about residency in general, the application process, how to have a strong application, etc. We have also recently welcomed a student liaison to our SIG leadership. All of these efforts are directed towards trying to improve residency application numbers for geriatric physical therapy programs.
