Research, Autistics, and Skill Building

- Adaptive behavior...age-appropriate, typical performance of daily activities based on social standards and expectations (Sparrow et al., 1989)
- When using VABS scores, the research has documented that adaptive behavior deficits are present and substantially deficient in individuals with ASD, regardless of intellectual level (e.g., Klin et al., 2007; Matthews et al., 2015; Szatmari et al., 2003; Tomanik et al., 2007)
- Adaptive skills have been shown to impact outcomes more so than cognitive level and autism symptom severity (Farley et al., 2009; Klin et al., 2007; Szatmari et al. 2003)

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Research, Autistics, and GASC

- Skills that promote independence in current and future environments have been linked to more positive outcomes for adults on the spectrum (Ayers et al., 2011)
- TRICARE authorizes the ABA Supervisor to "...[guide] the caregivers to utilize ABA TP protocols to reinforce adaptive behaviors."
- "...authorizations for services to the client should not be predicated on requirements for parents or other caregivers to participate in training or to implement treatment protocols with the client for any fixed, predetermined amount of time." (Clarifications Regarding CASP Practice Guidelines)
- "...while family training is supportive of the overall treatment plan, it is not a replacement for professionally directed and implemented treatment" (CASP Practice



ACD Policy & GASC 6010.59-M, April 1, 2015, Revision C-

- School setting limited to 97153 delivered by a BCBA (8.10.15)
- No services in the community (8.10.11)







CASP Practice Guidelines

- Use of treatment protocols that are implemented...across environments until discharge criteria are met (p. 9)
- No ABA model is specific to a particular location and all may be delivered in a variety of settings (p.18)
- Treatment across settings ...supports generalization and maintenance of treatment gains (p. 18)
- ABA treatment and consultation should be delivered in subsequent ...settings (residence to school, hospital to home) to successfully support and transition individuals
- School and community are both identified as a possible location for treatment (p.18)

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ACD Policy & GASC

6010.59-M, April 1, 2015, Revision C-85

 Requires that caregiver(s) be the ones to learn skills so they may teach ADLs outside of session time (8.10.19)

CASP Practice Guidelines

- Direct support and training of family members ... to promote optimal functioning and promote generalization and maintenance of behavioral improvements (p. 9)
- "...while family training is supportive of the overall treatment plan, it is not a replacement for professionally directed and implemented treatment" (p. 37)

















CASP's Concerns

Policy

- Not allowing the policy to align with GASC results in only aspects of ABA being allowed to be delivered - "less than" ABA services
- Improvement in adaptive behavior is one of the outcomes being measured

 yet excluded from ABA providers being able to directly address it, & measuring the caregiver(s) as the implementor(s)

Provider

 ABA providers continuing to encounter a myriad of challenges with the implementation of the benefit – many may not continue to provide services

Parents

- Measuring one variable (stress) has been very stressful for the parents
- Difficulty with access to and implementation of the benefit (e.g., diagnostic requirements, finding providers, challenges with waitlists)

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Requests & Next Steps

- Modify the current ACD policy to mirror how services are described as being delivered in the CASP Practice Guidelines (including addressing adaptive behavior)
- Allow the CPT codes to be delivered as they are defined and described by the AMA/in the CPT Supplemental Guidance
- \bullet Measure quality of life (Child and Family Quality of Life 2) across seven domains versus just stress
- Identify a method for implementing these improvements
- Monthly visits to DC
