

2024 Georgia General Election Recap

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 6 | 6AM

TOP-LINE RESULTS

- President **Donald Trump** carried the state with 50.75% of the vote
- Georgia's US House partisan split remains unchanged
- GOP retains control of both the state House and Senate despite three unsettled House races
- 4+ million of Georgia's registered voters cast a ballot early; another 1.2 million voted Tuesday

STATE SENATE

There are 56 seats in the state Senate. No seats flipped in the General Election. The GOP retains a simple majority with 33 members; Democrats hold 23 seats. All races appear settled.

The closest race involved Sen. **Shawn Still** (R-Norcross). He won 54-46 against a young, well-funded Democrat.

The other 20 incumbent Senators on the ballot won comfortably. Most seats strongly favor a single party.

Three open seats were settled yesterday. In total, four new Senators will be sworn in next year: three Democrats and one Republican.

US HOUSE

Georgia's congressional delegation partisan split remains unchanged, with 9 Republicans and 5 Democrats.

Democrat **Sanford Bishop** (GA-2) survived a legitimate challenge from the right but took 56% of the vote in southwest Georgia. All other incumbents were victorious.

Congressman **Drew Ferguson** announced in winter 2023 that he would not seek another term in Washington, setting up a highly-coveted open congressional seat in Georgia's third district. Trump-endorsed **Brian Jack** won easily in the deep red district.

STATE HOUSE

Eighty-one incumbents faced a contested General Election. Three seats remain too close to call, with a margin as narrow as 49 votes in middle Georgia District 128, currently held by Democrat **Mack Jackson**. The other close races are currently split; the GOP has the advantage in one and Democrats in the other.

The Republican majority remains solid. Should these close races hold, Democrats will net one seat overall, putting their caucus at 79 members. The GOP will hold 101 of the chamber's 180 seats.

Two incumbent Republicans fell short: **Ken Vance** (Milledgeville) and **Mesha Mainor** (Atlanta). The House will welcome at least 17 new members in January.

PRESIDENCY

President **Donald Trump** took Georgia's 16 electoral college votes, securing 51% of the vote, a margin of 115,605 votes over Vice President **Kamala Harris** votes as of this writing.

US SENATE

Neither of Georgia's US Senators faced voters this cycle. Sen. **Jon Ossoff** (D) is up for reelection in 2026. Sen. **Raphael Warnock** (D) will not run again until 2028.
