Keynote Speaker - Gil Penalosa, MBA, PhDhc, CSP | 8 80 Cities

Creating Vibrant & Healthy Cities for All

Gil Penalosa is passionate about cities for all people. He advises decision makers and communities on how to create vibrant cities and healthy communities for everyone regardless of age, gender and social, economic, or ethnic background. His focus is on the design and use of parks and streets as great public places, as well as sustainable mobility: walking, riding bicycles, using public transit, and new use of cars.

Gil is the founder and chair of the board of the internationally recognized non-profit organization 8 80 Cities, based in Canada. The organization was created centered on a simple but powerful philosophy; if you create a great city for an 8 year old and an 80 year old, you will create a successful city for all people. Gil also runs his own international consulting firm - Gil Penalosa & Associates and is an accomplished keynote speaker, facilitator of strategic workshops and advisor to decision makers and community groups. Because of Gil's unique blend of experience, pragmatism and passion, his leadership and advice is sought out by many cities and organizations; he has worked in over 300 different cities in all continents.

Gil has been a strong supporter and advocate for improving city parks, first making his mark in the late 1990s, when he led the transformation of Bogota's park system as Commissioner. During his tenure, Gil successfully led the design and development of over 200 parks including Simon Bolivar, a 113-hectare park in the heart of the city. His team also initiated the "new Ciclovia"/ Open Streets - a program that sees over 1.5 million people walk, run, skate and bike along 121 kilometers of Bogotá's city roads every Sunday, and today is internationally recognized and emulated.

Title:



Janette Sadik-Khan is one of the world's foremost authorities on transportation and urban transformation. She served as New York City's transportation commissioner from 2007 to 2013 under Mayor Michael Bloomberg, overseeing historic changes to the city's streets—closing Broadway to cars in Times Square, building nearly 400 miles of bike lanes and creating more than 60 plazas citywide.

A founding principal with Bloomberg Associates, she works with mayors around the world to reimagine and redesign their cities. She chairs the National Association of Transportation Officials, implementing new, people-focused street design standards, which have been adopted in 76 North American cities. She is the author of Streetfight: Handbook for an Urban Revolution.
