




LANDMARK ROOMS – BRONZE LEVEL

Activity 1: Southside Bike Tour 9:30 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. (Meet at West Tower Lobby at 9:00 a.m.) FREE TOUR

Also starting at Millennium Park, this tour heads straight to Chicago's Lakefront Trail and then south to 18th Street. Participants will experience many transit and pedestrian amenities, as well as a slice of Chicago's unique Mexican-American heritage, plus progressive infrastructure that looks ahead to the future of climate change. Highlights include the 18th Street Metra station and pedestrian overpass, the neighborhood of Pilsen, and the public art murals of the 18th St. Pink Line elevated station. Continuing on, the tour will stop at ongoing construction of new semi-permeable streets designed to deal with the increased rainfall from climate change, and possible a new separated bike lane. Also included are Chicago's Little Italy (Italian Ice, anyone?), the UIC campus, and the newly-opened multimodal facilities at the LaSalle St. Metra station.

Activity 2: Northside Bike Tour 1:00 p.m. – 3:30 p.m. (Meet at West Tower Lobby at 12:30 p.m.) FREE TOUR

This route highlights recent and future cyclinginfrastructure, unprecedented in Illinois, as well new developments in transit and Chicago's diverse land use. Beginning at the Millennium Park Bike Station, participants will ride the first-ever separated bike lane in Chicago and travel bike corridors that regularly see 20% and higher mode share during rush hour. They'll also visit a newly updated El station and experience the equally vast tracts of Chicago's working industry and treasured green space. Included are the future sites of both the Bloomingdale Trail (an abandoned elevated rail line slated to be converted to a mixed-use trail) and the Navy Pier Flyover.

Activity 3: Walking/Transit tour of the loop: 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. (Meet at West Tower Lobby at 8:30 a.m.) FREE TOUR

This walking tour of Chicago's Loop led by Active Trans employee and Chicago Architecture Foundation tour guide Dan Persky will highlight both new and timetested amenities for Chicago's commuters. Included are the first-of-its-kind-in-Chicago Kinzie Street separated bike lane, the Clark/Lake elevated station (with transfers between five CTA rail lines), and the famed Pedway, with underground pedestrian access from the city government buildings of Clark St to Michigan Ave offices and Metra stations. The ever-expanding Chicago Riverwalk will also be featured.


