We have just returned from Pittsburgh, where we hosted ACT's **Future of Commuting Summit**, bringing together over 100 TDM professionals from across North America.

The event was a huge success and marked an important point in our return to in-person events. It was so energizing to see the activity and hear the constant chatter of back-and-forth



discussion. Seeing the smiles and enthusiasm on the faces of attendees as the greeted colleagues and friends gave me great joy. For those that were there I hope you left as I did, uplifted and motivated to take on the new challenges facing TDM.

Prior to the start of the Summit, ACT's Board of Directors held its quarterly in-person meeting, which included a number of important agenda items relevant to the future of ACT, as we continue to advance key aspects of our strategic plan. It is wonderful to see that even as the pandemic has forced organizations to focus on foundational activities, ACT's leadership has been able to advance new strategic initiatives that will continue to advance the association and benefit its membership.

During the meeting, ACT's Board of Directors approved the formation of a **TDM Accreditation Committee** that will complete the work of developing an accreditation for TDM programs, setting for the first time, standards for the industry.

The **Future of Chapters Task Force**, which has been investigating the best model for ACT's chapter structure, presented to the Board a summary of findings from the recently completed membership survey. The discussions that followed will help the Task Force pull together a draft set of recommendations that will be further fleshed out with member based focus groups in the coming months.

We have a busy few months ahead of us as we prepare to host our International Conference in Chicago and continue to advance some key policy objectives at the federal level. 

#### We Saw the Future (of Commuting)

This week we had the pleasure of welcoming over 100 TDM professionals from across North America to our Future of Commuting Summit in Pittsburgh. We kicked off the day with breakfast, networking and some laughs with old friends and colleagues, catching up inperson for the first time for many in almost two years.

ACT's Executive Director, David Straus, gave the opening welcome along with Board President, Connie McGee, then introduce Lisa Kay Schweyer



(Carnegie Mellon University) who moderated our first panel "Transforming the Steel City" with Kim Lucas (City of Pittsburgh), Chris Watts (Pittsburgh Downtown Partnership), Vincent Valdes (Southwestern Pennsylvania Commission), and David Huffaker (Port Authority). During the panel, we took a closer look at the placemaking and commuter focused projects that are occurring around Pittsburgh and how exactly they're improving Pittsburgh for its citizens. We heard interesting points regarding what Pittsburgh needs to do in the future and what bold decisions are in front of its people.

#### Sandra Phillips, movmi

Sandra Phillips is the Founder and CEO of movmi, an agency focused on Shared Mobility, from micromobility, carsharing to Mobility-as-a-Service.

In 2014, Sandra founded movmi with the intention to expand the reach of shared mobility. Winning the TED/BMW Next Visionary contest in 2017 and her <u>TED talk integrating shared mobility with public transit</u> really accelerated movmi's work.

Sandra says, "movmi's social purpose is to build healthier communities by co-creating innovative mobility solutions that increase transportation options, while reducing dependency on private car ownership. And we know that



shared mobility services are key in doing that. It is a better way to get from point A to point B while using resources vastly more efficiently and avoiding over-investment in vehicles and infrastructure. It is making safe, efficient, convenient and affordable transportation more widely available, societally and globally."


The results of the survey will be shared at the 36th Annual International Conference in Chicago, and used to create more meaningful resources for those interested in the field.

#### **Vanpool Succeeds Through the Pandemic**

In recent months, members of the Valley of the Sun Chapter of the Association for Commuter Transportation (ACT) have seen a steady uptick in ridership and validation of Vanpool services. Due to rapidly increasing



gas prices and the return of in person work commuters in the Phoenix region have been looking to shift away from commuting with their personal vehicles. Public transit has also benefited from this desire to reduce travel costs as commuters shifted to light rail and bus services where Valley Metro has seen an increase in ridership from 478,243 in February of 2021 to 733,124 in February of 2022.

In a National Transit Database (NTD)
Report Analysis conducted by ACT's
Vanpool Council, it was learned that based

on the NTD data, vanpooling "an outstanding performer among the measured transit modes."
