ADA Compliance Changes for Digital Platforms



The Department of Justice (DOJ) recently updated its regulations under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), with important implications for ACT members who manage digital platforms. Public transit agencies, local governments, and other public entities are among those affected by the new rules, which establish clearer accessibility standards for websites, PDFs, videos, and mobile applications.

The updated regulations require covered organizations to conform to the latest [Web Content Accessibility Guidelines](#). For TDM professionals, this means taking a closer look at the digital tools and platforms your organization uses to serve the public.

If your agency or organization manages public-facing digital content, now is a good time to conduct an accessibility audit and ensure your platforms are on track for compliance.

Greenhouse Gas Endangerment Finding Repealed



In February, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued a final ruling rescinding its 2009 endangerment finding, which had previously determined that greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions from motor vehicles pose a threat to public health. Alongside this action, the EPA repealed GHG emissions standards for light-duty, medium-duty, and heavy-duty vehicles - standards that had served as a cornerstone of federal vehicle emissions policy for over a decade.

ACT is actively monitoring developments and will continue to track any downstream effects on federal transportation programs that impact the TDM community. We will keep members informed as the situation evolves.

ACT Joins Coalition Letter Supporting Robust Surface Transportation Funding



Last month, ACT signed on to a [coalition letter](#) led by the Transportation Trades Department (TTD) urging Congress to prioritize strong funding levels in surface transportation. The letter calls for funding in the next surface transportation reauthorization bill to match or exceed those established under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) - a benchmark that has been critical to

advancing multimodal transportation projects across the country.

The letter also advocates for advance appropriations, a key mechanism that provides federal transportation programs with greater funding reliability and allows agencies and organizations to plan more effectively for the long term.
