Here's what you can do to prevent workplace fires:

<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Store chemicals properly in tightly closed containers.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Read labels and MSDSs for the fire hazards related to the chemicals you use.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Keep flammable and combustible materials away from ignition sources.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Keep incompatible chemicals away from each other.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Check containers regularly for damage or leaks.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Clean flammable liquid spills right away and dispose of liquids; cleanup materials properly.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Make sure cords and plugs are in good condition before using electrical equipment.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Don't overload electrical circuits.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Keep hot equipment away from combustible materials.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Shut down electrical equipment that smokes or sparks.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Obey smoking rules and "No Smoking" signs.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Extinguish cigarettes and matches completely in designated containers.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Handle compressed gas cylinders carefully and keep them away from heat.
