INSTRUCTIONS FOR EXAMINERS

- 1. Give the driver a Vehicle Condition Report, select the truck to be used in the test, and instruct him/her to check the truck per the Vehicle Condition Report.
- 2. Select a pre-arranged route, consisting of street driving, intersections, railroad crossings, express-way driving, backing and parking. Parking may be done upon returning to the yard.
- 3. Observe the driver, using criteria mentioned on the Road Test Form, checking the number corresponding to your judgment of his/her performance.
- 4. Rating performance as follows:
  - (1) Poor
  - (2) Fair
  - (3) Good
  - (4) Excellent

A passing score of 100 points with a minimum of 42 points, in Section III – Driving, is required to qualify a driver for operating a tractor-trailer operator.

A passing score of 72 points with a minimum of 38 points in Section III – Driving, is required to qualify a driver for a straight truck operator.
