SIPAVICIUTE NAMED TO ALL-BIG EAST SECOND TEAM

Sophomore center **Vaida Sipaviciute** was named to the 2006 All-BIG EAST Second Team on Friday, March 3. Sipaviciute is the third all-league selection under head coach **Keith Cieplicki**. Sipaviciute finished 2005-06 ranked highly in several of the league's statistical categories. She was sixth in the conference in scoring average at 16.3 points per game and tied for 12th in rebounding average at 7.1 boards per outing. Sipaviciute ranked fifth in field-goal percentage (.533, 187-351) and led the BIG EAST in blocked shots per game (2.26).

Sipaviciute netted 441 points this season, tied for 10th with Julie McBride (2003-04) on the Orange's single-season scoring chart. Sipaviciute's 16.3 points per game scoring average tied for ninth on SU's single-season ledger. She recorded 10 games of 20 points or more, the third-most 20-point performances in school history and scored in double figures in 22 of the Orange's 27 games. Sipaviciute also etched her name in SU's single-game record book, scoring a record 41 points against Colgate on Nov. 29. She also pulled down 21 rebounds versus the Raiders, the second-best SU single-game board total. Sipaviciute's 53.3 percent shooting percentage ranked eighth on the Orange's single-season chart.

After two seasons, Sipaviciute already ranks fifth in career blocked shots at Syracuse (125) and this season became the first player since Holly Oslander in 1992-93 and 1993-94 to record back-to-back 60-block seasons. She is also the first player since Oslander (1991) to score at least 400 points and block at least 60 shots in the same year. Sipaviciute's 61 rejections in 2005-06 ranked ninth on SU's single-season list.

Sipaviciute is the 36th all-league selection in Orange women's basketball history and the 10th Orange player to earn second-team recognition.

The 2005-06 edition of the SU women's basketball team boasted eight players six feet tall or taller, the second-most six-footers in the BIG EAST last season. Louisville had the most with 10. SU's 2005-06 club was the tallest since the 1984-85 Orange squad, which also boasted eight players six feet tall or taller. Sophomore **Vaida Sipaviciute** was SU's tallest player at 6-4.

SU AT HALFTIME

SU is 36-8 since 2001-02 when leading at halftime. SU was 8-2 in 2004-05 and was 3-0 in 2003-04 when leading at the half. SU was 8-2 in 2002-03 when leading at the intermission, winning seven of their last eight games with a halftime advantage. Syracuse was 13-1 in 2001-02 when leading at halftime. **The Orange finished the 2005-06 season 4-3 when ahead at the intermission.**

INSIDE THE FG NUMBERS

Since the start of the 2002-03 season, SU is 32-15 when shooting better than its opponents and 5-58 when on the opposite end of the field goal percentage numbers. SU is 13-4 in the last four seasons when hitting at least half its shots.

CIEPLICKI EARNS WIN #150 VERSUS CANISIUS

Orange court boss **Keith Cieplicki** notched his 150th career triumph on Dec. 4 at Canisius. Cieplicki owns an overall record of 155-108 (.589) in nine seasons as a head coach and he is 28-55 (.337) in three years at SU. Cieplicki coached at the University of Vermont for five seasons before landing on The Hill. He is the Catamounts' all-time winningest coach with 127 victories.

THE DAWN OF A NEW ERA

The Orange's 81-76 victory against Massachusetts on Dec. 10, 2005 at the Carrier Dome marked the beginning of a new era in SU women's basketball. It was the first game for the Orange in the Carrier Dome since a Feb. 1, 1992 clash with Villanova. SU played 10 of its 13 games in the Carrier Dome in 2005-06.

Against the Minutewomen, **Vaida Sipaviciute** led the way for SU with a game-high 23 points. Juniors **Tracy Harbut** and **Ashley McMillen** also came up big for the Orange. Harbut tallied 19 points and a career-high 12 assists, while McMillen canned a personal-best five 3-point field goals and finished with a career-high 16 points. Syracuse used a 16-4 run that ate up six minutes on the clock in the second half then held off a late Minutewomen charge to post the victory. **The Orange is 13-12 (.520) all-time in the Dome and posted nine consecutive Dome victories from 1982-83 through 1986-87.**

LARGEST CROWD IN SU HISTORY TAKES IN CLASH WITH UCONN

The largest crowd ever to watch an SU women's basketball home game was on hand on Wednesday, Feb. 22, 2005 to see the Orange battle perennial power Connecticut in its final game at the Carrier Dome in 2005-06. A total of 3,779 spectators streamed through the turnstiles at the Dome, eclipsing the previous home record crowd of 3,517 fans that watched the Orange and the Huskies on Feb. 25, 1995 at Manley Field House. Four of the top five crowds in SU women's basketball history have come out for games versus Connecticut.

COMIN' TO YOUR CITY

Syracuse posted its seventh road victory of 2005-06 at Providence on Jan. 28 and finished the year 7-7 in road contests. Its seven road wins is the most under **Coach Keith Cieplicki** and represents the highest away victory for the Orange since it won eight road games in 1981-82 (not including neutral sites). Syracuse knocked off Manhattan (Nov. 18), Buffalo (Nov. 20), Canisius (Dec. 4), Albany (Dec. 20), Cornell (Dec. 29), Seton Hall (Jan. 21) and Providence (Jan. 28) this year away from the Salt City.

ORANGE LOVES NEW YORK

Syracuse's game versus St. John's on Feb. 25 was its ninth contest of 2005-06 against a squad located in the State of New York, and its loss to the Red Storm dropped its 2005-06 record versus New York foes to 6-3. The Orange posted victories against Manhattan, Buffalo, Colgate, Canisius, Albany and Cornell in 2005-06. Its three New York losses were to Niagara, Binghamton and St. John's. SU went 5-1 in 2004-05 against New York clubs. Its only loss was against the Red Storm. **In the last two years, SU is 11-4 versus New York foes.**

ORANGE SWEEPS BIG EAST WEEKLY HONORS

SU was the only team in the conference to have players earn Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week honors in the same week in 2005-06. Sophomore center **Vaida Sipaviciute** and freshman guard **Jenny Eckhart** turned the trick on Dec. 5. Sipaviciute was tabbed BIG EAST Player of the Week on the strength of her 41-point, 21-rebound performance against Colgate on Nov. 29. Sipaviciute's 41 points was the most ever for an SU player in a single game and her 21 boards rank second on the Orange single-game chart. The Kaunas, Lithuania native registered a double-double in SU's following game at Canisius on Dec. 4. She tallied 22 points and 12 rebounds to help the Orange to a 91-73 triumph versus the Golden Griffins. Eckhart chipped in a career-best 23 points at Canisius, including a 7-of-11 performance from the free-throw line on her way to Freshman of the Week honors. Against Colgate, Eckhart scored 16 points and hit a career-high four 3-pointers. The duo is fourth in SU history to sweep the league's weekly honors and the first Orange pair to achieve the feat since Julie McBride and Lauren Kohn won Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week accolades, respectively, on Jan. 18, 2004.

SU STRIKES FOR 90 IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES

Syracuse's offense came alive against Colgate on Nov. 29. The Orange racked up a season-high 92 points against the Raiders in a 92-56 thrashing of its Central New York neighbor at Manley Field House. **The scoring outburst represented the most points scored by the Orange since it put up 93 at West Virginia on Feb. 3, 2001.** Syracuse followed that scoring barage with a 91-point showing at Canisius in a 91-73 victory in Buffalo. It marked the first time since the Orange recorded back-to-back 90-point outings since 1995-96 when it defeated Coppin State, 101-38, and Canisius, 92-54, on consecutive days in the Carrier Classic.

SWAT TEAM

Syracuse blocked three shots at DePaul in the 2005-06 season finale on Feb. 28. The blocks increased SU's season total to 113, the fifth-best single-season team total in school history. Sophomore **Vaida Sipaviciute** led the team with 61 rejections, which ranked ninth on the Orange's individual single-season blocks chart. Junior **Tracy Harbut** was second on the team with 20 swats. Freshman **Brittany Smith** also reached double figures in blocks with 11. The Orange finished fifth in the BIG EAST in blocks per game (4.19) and the SU defense rejected at least five shots 11 times in 2005-06. The 1992-93 SU squad set the school record with 136 rejections.

CRASHING THE DEFENSIVE GLASS

The Orange secured 28 defensive rebounds in its 2005-06 season finale at DePaul to raise its defensive boards total to 721 for the season. SU led the conference in defensive rebounds at 26.7 per game. Sophomore **Vaida Sipaviciute** paced SU with 139 defensive rebounds and she ranked ninth in the BIG EAST in defensive rebounding average (5.15 per game). Junior **Tracy Harbut** snared 121 defensive caroms and those two players accounted for 36.1 percent (260-721) of all of the Orange's defensive boards. SU grabbed a season-high 41 defensive boards in its 92-56 thumping of Colgate on Nov. 29.

SHOULDN'T BE SHOCKING

Coach Keith Cieplicki has never shyed away from having freshmen in the starting lineup. In 2005-06 he had at least two rookies in the starting lineup in 26 of 27 games and **Jenny Eckhart** became the first SU freshman to start every game since Julie Angelina in 1993-94. **In 2004-05, SU had three freshmen in the starting five on nine occasions and SU has started at least one first-year player in 80 straight games. The last time the Orange didn't have a freshman in the starting five was on Nov. 28, 2003 against Montana in the Rainbow Wahine Classic.**

THE MAGIC NUMBER

SU is 41-11 (.788) in its last 52 games when hitting the 60-point mark. **SU was 9-2 in 2005-06 when scoring 60 or more points.** The Orange went 11-3 in 2004-05 when scoring 60-or-more points in a game. On the other side of the spectrum, SU was 2-13 when not reaching the 60-point plateau in 2004-05 and was 0-16 in 2005-06 season when scoring fewer than 60 points.

20-20-20 VISION

Jenny Eckhart (23 points), Vaida Sipaviciute (22 points), and Tracy Harbut (21 points) each topped the 20-point mark at Canisius on Dec. 4. **It marked the first time in more than 20 years that three SU players tallied at least 20 points in the same game.** They became the first Orange trio to achieve the feat since Missy Renehan (28 points), Connie Stough (23 points), and Chris Palombi (20 points) turned the trick against Georgetown on Jan. 13, 1984.

The Orange went 29-of-40 from the free-throw line at Canisius on Dec. 4. Its 29 makes from the charity stripe was one shy of the team record (30) set against Boston University on Jan. 5, 1982 and equaled on Feb. 24, 1988 versus Providence. SU's 40 attempts was five shy of the school standard.

TEN 20'S

Sophomore center **Vaida Sipaviciute** finished the 2005-06 campaign with 10 20-point games, which tied her with Julie McBride and Paula Moore for the third-most 20-point outings in team history. In her

final 20-point effort of the year, Sipaviciute came off the bench to net 25 points against Providence on Jan. 28 to lead the Orange to a 77-76 overtime win against the Friars. Sipaviciute just missed tying former Orange standout Holly Oslander for second on SU's single-season, 20-point games ledger. Oslander tallied at least 20 points 11 times in 2000-01.

SIPAVICIUTE FINISHES TIED FOR 10TH ON SU SEASON SCORING
LEDGER

Sipaviciute put up 16 points at DePaul in the Orange's season finale to finished the 2005-06 season with 441 points, tying SU career scoring leader Julie McBride for 10th on the SU single-season points chart. Sipaviciute averaged 16.3 points per game in 2005-06 and tallied at least 20 points 10 times. Against Colgate on Nov. 29, Sipaviciute established a new Orange single-game record with a career-best 41 points. The Kaunas, Lithuania native did the majority of her damage against non-conference opponents, averaging 21.5 points per outing in SU's 11 non-league encounters. For her career, Sipaviciute has 652 career points and owns a career scoring average of 11.6 points per game.

NO SOPHOMORE SLUMP

Sipaviciute tallied 441 points in 2005-06, more than doubling her 211-point showing as a rookie in 2004-05. Sipaviciute scored in double figures in 22-of-26 games in 2005-06, including netting her 600th career marker at Louisville on Feb. 12. She completed the season ranked fourth on the Orange's all-time sophomore scoring chart (right).

SIPAVICIUTE LEADS BIG EAST IN BLOCKS PER GAME FOR SECOND
CONSECUTIVE YEAR

Sipaviciute led the BIG EAST Conference in blocked shots average (2.26) in 2005-06. It was the second straight year she finished at the top of that statistical category (Sipaviciute led the league at 2.21 blocks per contest in 2004-05). She is the second consecutive player to lead the conference in blocks per game in two consecutive seasons joining Virginia Tech's Ieva Kublina who led the league in rejections in 2002-03 and 2003-04. Sipaviciute has tallied at least one block in 46 of her 56 career games. She finished the year with 61 rejections to become the first SU player since Holly Oslander in 1992-93 and 1993-94 to record back-to-back 60-swat seasons. Sipaviciute also became the first player since Oslander in 1990-91 to score 400 points and block at least 60 shots in the same campaign.

A NIGHT TO REMEMBER

Sipaviciute put on one of the most impressive displays in Syracuse women's basketball history against Colgate on Nov. 29. Sipaviciute set the Orange single-game record with 41 points, breaking the previous mark of 39 established by Holly Oslander against Boston College in 1991. Sipaviciute also pulled down 21 rebounds, becoming the third player in school history to grab 20 boards in one game. Sipaviciute's rebound total was the second-highest single-season total in team history behind Sue Scholl's team record 24 caroms versus Rochester in 1978. Sipaviciute hit 16-of-25 attempts from the field and set career highs in free throws made (9) and attempted (13). Her 16 made field goals is tied with Oslander for the second-most in team history. Sitting on 39 points, Sipaviciute went to the free throw line with 5:04 left in the game and connected on a pair of charity shots to claim the record. She was subsequently removed from the contest by Coach Keith Cieplicki to a standing ovation from the Manley Field House faithful.

MUCH IMPROVED

Sipaviciute improved her free throw percentage dramatically in 2005-06. She converted 67-of-92 (.728) attempts to increase her free-throw percentage more than 35 percent from 2004-05. In 2004-05, Sipaviciute finished the season shooting 37 percent from the foul line (17-46). This season she ranked second on the team in free-throw shooting for the year behind **Tracy Harbut** (.745) and hit 24 consecutive free throws during the month of January. It was the longest such streak for an SU hoopster since Julie McBride connected on 27 straight charity shots in 2003-04.

IRON WOMAN

Freshman guard **Jenny Eckhart** was one of two players (**Tracy Harbut**) to start all 27 games for the Orange in 2005-06. She was the first freshman to start every game of her first season since Julie Angelina in 1993-94. Eckhart rarely got a breather, playing the entire game 11 times. Eckhart finished the season second in the BIG EAST in minutes played per game at 37.63. Her minutes played total (1,016) ranked 10th on SU's single-season list and her average minutes played total was the fourth-highest in team history.

MAKING HER MARK

Eckhart was one of three SU players to score 200 points in 2005-06 and she ranked third on the team in scoring at 9.9 points per outing. She opened the season by becoming the first SU freshman in more than 25 years to tally 20 points in her first collegiate contest. Eckhart scored in double figures in 13 of the Orange's 27 contests. On Dec. 5, she claimed BIG EAST Rookie of the Week honors after netting a career-best 23 points at Canisius and she was named to the conference's weekly honor roll on Jan. 30 after averaging 18.0 points per game in SU's only two BIG EAST wins of the season. Eckhart led the team in 3-point field goals (37) and 3-point field goal percentage (.339) in 2005-06. Her shooting clip from behind the arc ranks fifth on SU's career list among players with at least 30 career treys.

ECKHART AMONG SU'S BEST FRESHMAN SCORERS AND PLAYMAKERS

Eckhart proved herself as a consistent scoring threat in 2005-06 averaging 9.9 points per game, the third-best mark on the Orange. She finished with 267 points, the ninth-best scoring season by an SU freshman in school history.

Eckhart also became one of SU's top 10 freshman assist leaders in 2005-06. She was second on the team behind **Tracy Harbut** with 78 helpers and finished the year ranked sixth among Orange rookies in assists. Eckhart's average of 2.89 assists per game ranked in the top 20 nationally among freshman. She dished out a career-high seven assists against Quinnipiac on Dec. 22, and Sacred Heart on Nov. 27. Eckhart registered at least three assists 12 times in 2005-06.

ECKHART'S DEBUT ONE OF SU'S BEST EVER

Eckhart put herself in rare company with her performance in SU's season-opening victory at Manhattan on Nov. 18. She led all scorers in the game with 20 points, including 15 in the second half, on 7-of-11 shooting from the floor while playing all 40 minutes. Eckhart buried four three-pointers and calmly stepped to the free-throw line with four seconds left on the clock and connected on a pair of charity shots to clinch the victory. Eckhart was the first SU freshman to score 20 points in her collegiate debut since **Marva Cook** hung 23 points on Canisius on Dec. 2, 1979, a span of 26 years. Eckhart's point total was the most by an SU player in her first collegiate game since **Bonnie Baker**, then a junior, tallied 23 points against Penn State in her SU debut on Nov. 20, 1984.

HARBUT HAS BREAKOUT JUNIOR SEASON

Forward **Tracy Harbut** shattered her career totals in practically every statistical category during her phenomenal junior campaign. The Lexington, Ky. began her third season on the hill with 148 points and a 3.6 points per game career scoring average. She obliterated those marks in 2005-06 scoring 305 points and finishing second on the team in points per game at 11.3. She also posted career bests in minutes played (987), minutes played per game (36.6), field goals made (116), field goals attempted (317), free throws made (73), free throws attempted (98), rebounds (165) assists (119), blocks (20) and steals (31). Harbut notched the first four double-doubles of her career in 2005-06, including two in row to start the season (at Manhattan and Buffalo). She also established single-game career highs in every statistical category except 3-point field goals made and attempted in 2005-06.

VISION QUEST

Harbut was an assist machine for the Orange during the 2005-06 season, leading SU in helpers a total of 15 times. Harbut tallied 119 assists on the season and ranked seventh in the BIG EAST in assists per game at 4.41. **She became the first SU frontcourt player in school history to reach 100 assists in a single campaign.** The previous 23 times an SU women's hoopster reached the century mark in assists in one year it was achieved by a guard. In her first two years at SU, Harbut totaled just 60 helpers.

MORE HARBUT ASSIST NOTES

Harbut tallied a career-best 12 assists in SU's victory against Massachusetts on Dec. 10 at the Carrier Dome. She also racked up 19 points to become the first SU player since Julie McBride in 2002 to record a points/assists double-double. McBride achieved the feat with 10 points and 10 assists versus San Francisco on Jan. 2, 2002. Harbut completed the 2005-06 season fourth on SU's junior assists chart (right).

Like Jenny Eckhart, Harbut went the distance in a game several times in 2005-06. Harbut played the entire contest on nine occasions. Eckhart and Harbut played the entire game together six times (vs. Canisius, at Pittsburgh, vs. Quinnipiac, at Cornell, vs. Louisville, at Providence). Harbut ranked fifth in the BIG EAST in minutes played per game at (36.56).

HARBUT HAS CAREER NIGHT VERSUS LOUISVILLE

Harbut was the catalyst for the Orange offense versus Louisville on Jan. 3 and finished the game with a career-best 24 points, the most points by an SU women's player ever at the Dome. Nineteen of her points came in the first half as she almost single-handedly kept the Orange in the game. Harbut converted 6-of-15 attempts from the field and set career bests with 12 free throws made and 15 free throws attempted. Her 12 makes from the charity stripe tied her for sixth on SU's single-game ledger.

SMITH CEMENTS STARTING POSITION

After missing SU's first six games in 2005-06, freshman **Brittany Smith** made appearances in the Orange's final 21 contests, including starts in 10 of SU's last 11 games. In her 21 appearances she netted at least two points 20 times. The only time she was held scoreless came against St. John's on Feb. 25 when she played a career-low six minutes. Smith averaged 5.9 points and 5.3 rebounds per game in 2005-06 and was one of SU's most reliable free throw shooters at 72.2 percent from the charity stripe. She also connected on her only 3-point attempt of the year, draining a trifecta versus Notre Dame at the Carrier Dome on Jan. 31.

PASSING HER BOARD EXAM

Smith led the Orange in rebounding six times in 2005-06. She secured a personal-best 11 boards at South Florida and versus Cincinnati. Against the Bearcats, she grabbed a career-high six offensive rebounds. The Milwaukee, Wisc. averaged 5.3 caroms per game and pulled down at least five boards 11 times in her 21 appearances.

SAVING HER BEST FOR LAST

Sophomore guard **Amanda Adamson** played her best game of the 2005-06 campaign in the season finale at DePaul on Feb. 28. Adamson connected on a personal-best three trifectas in 20 minutes of action to finish with a season-high nine points against the Blue Demons. She also matched her career high with six rebounds in the contest and added an assist and two steals. Adamson appeared in 25 of SU's 27 games and ranked third on the squad with nine 3-point field goals. She averaged 2.8 points per outing.

JOHNSON SPARKS SU

Syracuse native **Cintia Johnson** started SU's last nine games of 2005-06 and averaged 5.2 points per game in those contests, 2.2 points better than her season scoring average of 3.0 points per outing. Johnson recorded the first double-digit scoring effort of her career in the Orange's home finale versus St. John's on Feb. 25. She netted 12 points on 3-of-8 shooting from the field. She also connected on a personal-best six free throws against the Red Storm. In addition to her career day versus St. John's, Johnson pulled down a career-high nine rebounds at Louisville on Feb. 12, and she scored six points at Providence on Jan. 28, including a pair of free throws with 40 seconds left in regulation to help send the game into overtime.

Johnson finished the year second on the team with 29 steals.

LAIMBEER FINDS NICHE

Freshman forward **Keri Laimbeer** averaged 4.2 points per game in SU's final nine contests of 2005-06, two of which were victories (at Seton Hall on Jan. 25 and at Providence on Jan. 28). She was one of the Orange's most productive players off the bench and averaged 13.9 minutes per game over that nine-game stretch. Laimbeer appeared in 24 games during her rookie season and averaged 3.1 points and 2.1 rebounds per game. The Orchard Lake, Mich. product made an immediate impact for the Orange, playing a career-best 35 minutes and scoring a personal-best 15 points to help lead SU to a 65-61 victory at Manhattan in the season opener on Nov. 18.

ANTOLICK EFFICIENT AGAINST DEPAUL

Redshirt freshman **Sara Antolick** just missed setting a career high for points in the Orange's 2005-06 season finale at DePaul on Feb. 28. Antolick netted 12 points in 20 minutes off the bench versus the Blue Demons, one short of her career best. She buried a personal-best six field goals in the contest and finished the game 6-for-8 from the floor. The Bethlehem, Pa. product was hampered by injuries for the second straight year, missing SU's first five games with a knee injury. She returned to make 11 starts in 22 appearances. Antolick finished the year tied for third on the team with **Brittany Smith** in rebounds per game at 5.3. Against West Virginia on Jan. 7, she tallied a personal-best 13 points and a career-high three blocked shots.

SU MAKES SEVEN TELEVISION APPEARANCES IN 2005-06

The Orange appeared on television seven times in 2005-06, including three appearances (Dec. 10 vs. Massachusetts, Jan. 3 vs. Louisville, Jan. 31 vs. Notre Dame) on Time Warner Sports 26 in Syracuse. Those three dates were announced on Dec. 5 as part of SU's comprehensive television agreement with Time Warner that also included several men's basketball, men's lacrosse and women's lacrosse home games. The Orange's road game at Villanova on Tuesday, Jan. 10 was selected as one of College Sports Television's (CSTV) "Tuesday Game of the Week" telecasts. In addition, the Orange's road contests at Louisville (Feb. 12) and at Rutgers (Feb. 19) were televised as part of the conference's regional television package. Connecticut Public Television (CPTV) aired SU's Dome clash with the Huskies on Feb. 22 in which an SU record crowd of 3,779 fans were in attendance.
