CSC ALL-TIME AWARDS LIST (BY AWARDS) THROUGH 2025

The original 39 CSC Hall of Fame members in 1969 were selected in three categories. The 39 represented one member for every year of American College Public Relations Association's (ACPRA) Sports Section and the new CoSIDA organization. The list honored SIDs from all sections dating back to ACPRA's start in 1931-32 (Sports Section). There were 13 honorees selected from the ACPRA Era of 1931-42, 13 from the Early CSC Era of 1943-56 and 13 from the CSC Era of 1957-69. The 39 SIDs were honored with Helms Hall of Fame-CoSIDA Awards at the Kickoff Luncheon on July 29, 1969 in Los Angeles, Calif.

ARCH WARD AWARD

The Arch Ward Award has been presented annually since 1958 to a member who has made an outstanding contribution to the field of college sports information, and who by his or her activities, has brought dignity and prestige to the profession. Ward was sports editor of the Chicago Tribune from 1930 until he died in 1955. He is credited with inventing the concept of an all-star contest. All-star games began in 1933 with the first baseball all-star game. The following year, Ward initiated the College All-Star football game. The award has gone to a University Division member 65 times in 67 years. The two exceptions were Fred Nuesch in 1996 and Jeff Hodges in 2017.
