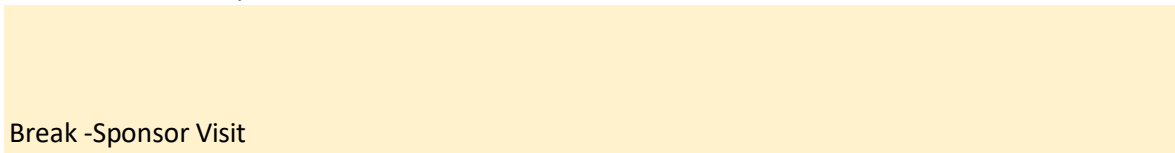

**Reimagining Kindergarten Mathematics: A Brand-New Start**

2:20-3:20 This presentation will focus on key mathematical content including: conservation of number, one to one correspondence, perceptual versus figurative counting, forward and backward number word sequence and how each of these develops in young children. Each of these topics are an important part of the puzzle that young children construct when making sense of number. Research shows early numeracy skills predict future math and literacy success. Deepen your understanding of the critical math concepts in this early grade and how to support teachers in putting mathematics on equal footing with literacy. We will unpack rich tasks and view videos of students engaging in mathematics to anchor our conversations.
