Joseph Kaczmarczyk, DO, MPH, MBA, Since Dr. Joseph M. Kaczmarczyk retired as the Vice Dean of the Osteopathic Medicine program on the Philadelphia campus of the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (PCOM) in July 2022, he has received two lifetime achievement awards. Dr. Kaczmarczyk was the very first osteopathic physician ever to receive the Association of Professors of Gynecology and Obstetrics (APGO) Lifetime Achievement Award to honor APGO leaders who have demonstrated consistency of work in furthering the goals of ob-gyn academic medicine, commitment to an academic career, and the importance of the awardee's work

to ob-gyn medical education. Additionally, Dr. Kaczmarczyk was awarded the Angela R. Kyte Outstanding Alumnus Award, given in honor of a lifetime of service to humanity and whose life exemplifies those qualities encouraged and fostered at Lycoming College. Culminating his academic career, he received *Professor Emeritus* from PCOM on May 23, 2024.

Previously, Dr. Kaczmarczyk was the Interim Dean and Chief Academic Officer of PCOM Georgia in Suwanee, GA for more than a year during the COVID-19 pandemic. A 1982 graduate of PCOM, Dr. Kaczmarczyk has held other leadership positions within PCOM, including Associate Dean of Clinical Education and Associate Dean of Undergraduate Medical Education. In addition, Dr. Kaczmarczyk served as President of the American College of Osteopathic Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOOG) during 2002-2003.

Dr. Kaczmarczyk was appointed to the 16-member Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) Clinician Educator Milestones 2.0 Work Group. Drawing on his extensive background, he contributed to the development of the Clinician Educator Milestones, supplemental guide, and accompanying white paper, which collectively are strikingly unique as the first national effort focused on the clinician educator and timely, with DEI and well-being included as one of four domains. Most recently, Dr. Kaczmarczyk was a co-author of "Clinician Educator Milestones: Assessing and Improving Educators' Skills" published in *Academic Medicine*, one of the most prestigious journals in medical educational.

Prior to joining PCOM, Dr. Kaczmarczyk served as a Commissioned Officer in the United States Public Health Service (USPHS) for 23 years and retired at the rank of Captain. His last USPHS assignment was as a Medical Officer in the Contraception and Reproductive Health Branch of the Eunice Kennedy Shriver National Institute for Child Health and Human Development, National Institutes of Health where he was responsible for medical oversight of a \$12 million contraceptive clinical trials network, while simultaneously serving as the Program Officer for a \$5 million clinical trials network—the Pelvic Floor Disorders Network (PFDN). His previous USPHS assignments included the Medical Officer for the Office of Women's Health, Food and Drug Administration; Senior Medical Advisor for the White House Commission on Complementary and Alternative Medicine Policy; Medical Officer in the Bureau of Primary Health Care, Health Resources and Services Administration; and a Medical Officer (Obstetrician Gynecologist) in the Indian Health Service.
