I'm the president of a small community-based non-profit called Windham Neighbors Helping Neighbors, currently serve on the board of the Sportsman's Alliance of Maine, and currently work professionally with several non-profits including Walk a Mile in Their Shoes (child abuse prevention led by Bill Diamond), Simsbury Land Trust (CT), Granby Land Trust (CT), Holcombe Farm (CT), Canton Land Conservation Trust (CT), and the New Hartford Land Trust (CT).

1. Advocate to prevent child abuse and death 2. Promote good governance principals and legislation 3. Support effective natural resource stewardship through conservation

Please provide specific ways in which, if elected, you would partner with the nonprofit sector to achieve the goals of your campaign. *

I've always partnered with non-profits in the past to get legislation passed. For my caregiver/spouse bill I partnered with the AARP. When I established the Maine School Safety Center the Sportsman's Alliance of Maine was my partner. During my last term I worked with Maine Coast Heritage Trust, Nature Conservancy, and SAM to get \$40 million put in the LMF account. My work with these non-profits included sponsoring legislation, working with them to rally supporters, developing strategies for public hearings and work sessions, and writing effective speeches. I love working with non-profits.
