Please describe your top 3 policy goals. *

I don't believe in banning book bans, but libraries, schools, and educators need support so they don't have to address these instances as frequently or have to worry about doing so. Book challenges are taking away too many resources.

-Broadly speaking, support climate action initiatives.
