

Scholarships

AWWA provides over \$200,000 annually in scholarships and awards. We recognize the importance of investing in students as the future of the water industry. AWWA's Water Equation manages the more than 26 scholarships to support student water industry education.

AWWA ABEL WOLMAN FELLOWSHIP

This \$30,000 fellowship is renewable for a second year for one PhD student in the USA, Canada, Mexico and at international universities where there is an AWWA student chapter who are pursuing advanced training and research in the field of water supply and treatment.

Deadline: Early December

AWWA LARSON AQUATIC RESEARCH SUPPORT (LARS) SCHOLARSHIP

Provides financial support to graduate students preparing for careers in the fields of science or engineering.

Awarded annually. Will provide one-time funding for two scholarships: \$5,000 for a master's student \$7,000 for a doctoral student

ADDITIONAL AWWA SCHOLARSHIPS
