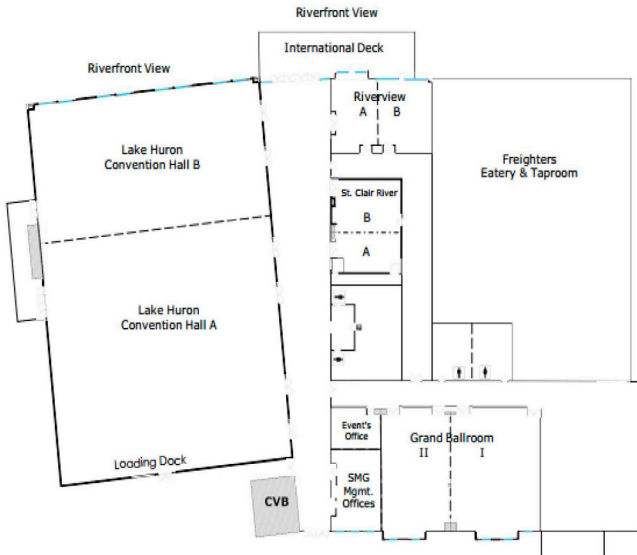
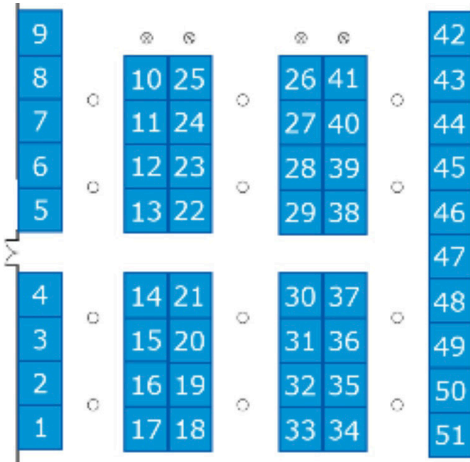
SWIE Chance Auction
