## Program Eligibility Requirements

- 3-5 years of healthcare-related experience beyond residency or training.
- Commitment to complete the entire two-year curriculum.

**Program Starts:** October 1, 2025

**Format:** The class sessions will be 12 day-long in-person sessions held over 2 years.

**Tuition:** \$7,800 (50% - \$3,900 is payable by September 15, 2025)
