# History

# F

ounded in 1981 as “The Support Center of Oklahoma” by Pat and Ray Potts, the Oklahoma Center for Nonprofits seeks to strengthen the leadership and capacity of nonprofit organizations in Oklahoma through training, advocacy and guidance as well as improving the functions of nonprofits. As the state’s preeminent support structure for nonprofits, the Center facilitates workshops, trainings and consultations along with the industry’s definitive capacity building program, the Standards for Excellence. In 2007, the Center became the first organization in Oklahoma to be awarded the Standards for Excellence Institute Seal. As the sole provider of Standards for Excellence, the Center has enabled more than 400 organizations to complete the training since its inception. The Center also operates a membership and policy program to provide member organizations a singular voice for advocacy on nonprofit legislative issues. Finally, the Center operates a free helpline for all Oklahoma nonprofits to answer questions about any topic relating to organizational management.



# Training and Consulting



Training and consulting are our flagship programs that provide didactic training, embedded consultation and executive education in nonprofit best practices (including the nationally recognized “Standards for Excellence Series”) to nonprofit organizations of diverse sizes, constituencies and service areas. Funds to support the training programs come from a mix of foundation, corporate, individual and event income, as well as earned income from the fees associated with the workshops and consultation projects. Because those fees only cover a third of the costs associated with training, the Center gratefully appreciates support from generous community partners to ensure training is available to all organizations, regardless of ability to pay.

The Center answered more than 1,300 Helpline calls in fiscal year 2013. The Helpline is a free service to any nonprofit in Oklahoma seeking guidance on issues from board governance to HR and everything in between. These calls accounted for nearly 430 hours of expert advice.

# Standards for Excellence


The Standards for Excellence Series is a specialized training program designed to give nonprofit organizations the tools and knowledge necessary to increase transparency and effectiveness in pursuing their missions. The Standards for Excellence program was created by the Maryland Association of Nonprofit Organization in 1998, and they soon enabled other states to replicate the program with materials created by the Standards for Excellence Institute in 2004. The Standards for Excellence program comprises:

- Eight guiding principles and 55 performance standards
- Basis of self-assessment
- Model for best practices
- Empowerment tool to help nonprofits meet the highest standards of nonprofit governance, management and operations
- Code for self-regulation for the nonprofit sector



These principles exceed the minimum legal requirements and establish a new set of standards to classify how well-managed and responsibly governed nonprofits should operate. The Center and the Standards for Excellence institute continue to develop comprehensive educational materials and public awareness efforts to support best practices in the eight areas to which the program's principles apply: mission and program, governing body, conflict of interest, human resources, financial and legal, openness, fundraising and public affairs and public policy.

# STRING


## What is STRING?

The Statewide Rural Initiative for Nonprofit Growth (STRING) is a new pilot program initiated by the Oklahoma Center for Nonprofits to better serve the organizations in the rural parts of the state. The Center has a long history of effectively supporting nonprofits in Oklahoma, but geographic distance and limited resources make traveling to the training centers in Oklahoma City or Tulsa challenging for many organizations. The STRING program was born out of the Center's five year strategic plan and Sarkeys Foundation provided the founding investment.

## What STRING Does

The program is designed to reach nonprofits in the southern part of the state. It focuses on the following communities: Lawton, Duncan, Ardmore, Durant, Ada, Hugo, McAlester and Altus. The Center hired Janetta Cravens as the coordinator for the program to create a personal presence in these communities.

## STRING Strategy



**1. BUILD RELATIONSHIPS:** Learn about the nonprofits and their leadership. Share the work of the Center by promoting memberships and trainings, but primarily, listen and learn.



**2. BRING IN TRAININGS:** Follow up relationships built and partnerships formed by bringing trainings the Center already does to the area, like the Standards for Excellence series.



**3. CREATE NEW METHODS:** Use new models for adult learning available through technology to create ways for people in similar roles but who are geographically separated to learn and collaborate.

# Public Policy

The Oklahoma Center for Nonprofits is dedicated to uniting the nonprofit sector through advocacy and membership. Advocacy allows nonprofits to present a collective voice at the legislature, in front of regulatory agencies, and with the public. The Center provides quality sector information, tracks legislation, keeps nonprofits informed of important issues, and educates Oklahomans about the value of the nonprofit sector and its contributions to the state.

## Total Membership By Counties\*



\$750,000 +	(28%)


### Membership By Counties

## OKLAHOMA NONPROFIT EXCELLENCE AWARDS

The Oklahoma Nonprofit Excellence (ONE) Awards annually honors the outstanding work of Oklahoma nonprofits. As a fundraising and recognition event for the Center, 24 organizations from throughout the state receive cash awards honoring their achievements, dedication to community and mission, excellence in service to constituents and high standards in management. Each year, the Center gives nearly \$150,000 to these organizations during the Tulsa-based award ceremony, and features their work in a comprehensive video outlining their accomplishments. Honorees are nominated and selected by the ONE Awards Selection Commission and then invited to apply for awards. The Commission comprises leaders from throughout the state representing a wide variety of backgrounds and interests.
