Today, as I oversee community relations for Blue Cross Blue Shield of Oklahoma along with The Oklahoma Caring Foundation, I recognize how significant best practices are in creating effective, transparent and accountable nonprofits. Moreover, as a board member of both the Center and of Infant Crisis Services in Oklahoma City, I take my role as a director more seriously and more confidently. The Center provides the foundation upon which a strong nonprofit sector can prosper; it helps the sector build capacity while providing a very important voice for the nonprofits in our state. This provides vital resources to fill gaps that other pieces of our state infrastructure create.

The charitable sector also provides a purpose and focus for corporate, business and philanthropic leaders and an avenue for those leaders to share their success. # AT ALL THE TIMES YOU CAN

## At All the Times You Can: Advocating for the Sector

Before joining the Center's board, I had been on the board of my local United Way for several years and was asked to update our by-laws. One of the first resources I reached out to was the Center. They provided the input that was needed to assure the by-laws reflected the guidance and values of our organization.

To be a truly effective nonprofit there must be a strong leadership and a strong board. The value of the Center is the training and consulting they offer to the nonprofits across Oklahoma and creating the forums that allow nonprofits to share and learn from each other.

Advocacy is also critical for nonprofits. Legislators and policy makers are constantly faced with issues where they lack a depth of knowledge or an understanding of the unintended consequences that might occur with any change. In cases like these, good legislators and look to individuals and organizations that are knowledgeable, trusted and representative of the values and beliefs of Oklahomans. The Center is there to help.

I have been on both sides of advocacy with the Center. As a legislator I was approached with authoring a bill that made changes benefiting all nonprofits and was also supported by the State agencies impacted by the change. Even after my service in the Senate, there was an attempt to make changes that would be detrimental to the nonprofits of Oklahoma. The Center led the effort to keep this change from being implemented, and I had the opportunity to be part of that effort. The Center truly led the sector on these issues.

It is important for our legislators to have an understanding of the compassion and value nonprofits bring to the constituents of their districts and to support this effort. This understanding is best fostered by the local nonprofit employees, board members and clients reaching out to the legislators to demonstrate the value and the impact of the sector.

## 2017 LEGISLATIVE HIGHLIGHTS

**HB 2347** The bill would have capped charitable giving deductions (along with other itemized deductions) at \$17,000. The Center successfully lobbied to have the bill amended to exclude charitable deductions. The Center believes charitable giving incentives are vital to the health and effectiveness of the sector.

**Johnson Amendment** The Center continues to oppose any changes to IRS guidelines prohibiting 501c3 organizations from endorsing candidates or political parties for office. We believe that charities are stronger when they remain nonpartisan and we will oppose any federal changes that would weaken or eliminate this important 1954 rule.

**Charitable Giving Incentives** The Center promotes the value of the charitable giving incentive at both the federal and state levels, and will continue to advocate for keeping all incentives intact. Additionally, the Center encourages Congress to consider a "non-itemizer, universal deduction" to encourage all Americans to give to charity and have the same benefits as those who itemize.

**Fair Budgeting and Contracting** Because many organizations within the charitable sector rely heavily on government contracts, fee-for-service reimbursements and other public funding, the Center advocates that nonprofits receiving funding not sustain cuts.




