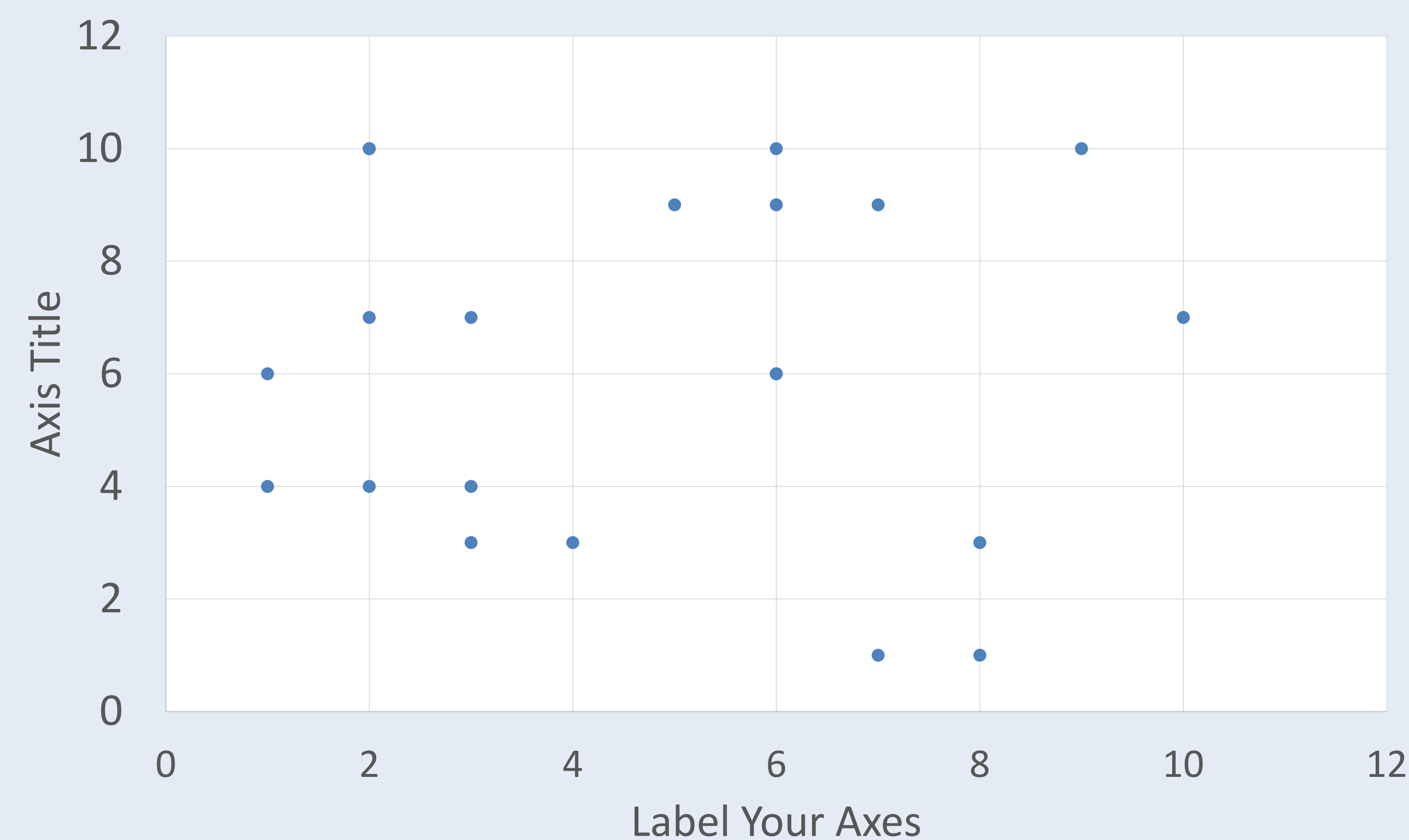

## Methods

List your Design:

- Setting
- Measures
- Outcome data
- Analytic methods

Typical considerations:

- Sample size and demographics
  - Validity of Measures
  - Statistical approach
  - Significance and effect size
- The validity of the work should be demonstrable, but due to word constraints, does not need to be exhaustive

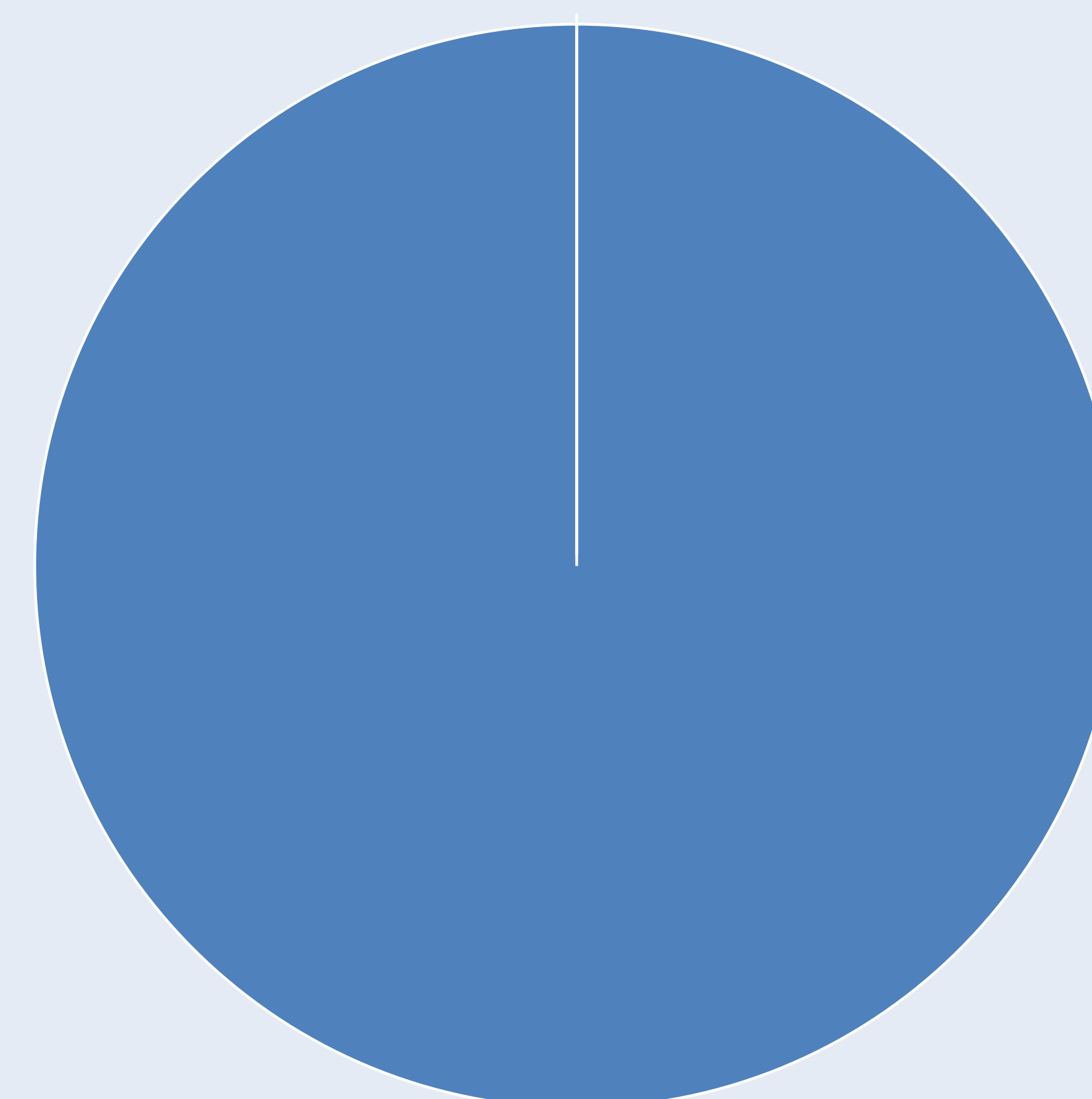
## Discussion

- Interpret the implications of your results
- Take care to infer only so far as the data suggest.
  - Don't over-interpret your results or present opinions that may not be supported by the data
- Suggest future areas for exploration that may be indicated by your findings
