





lent certification from another country. This memorandum, and numerous phone calls between the six founding members of the SBI, laid the groundwork for the pivotal year of 1985.

A memorandum dated February 8,1985, from my office, contains the following sentences: "All of us (6) thought that

So congratulations we have now formed the Society for Breast Imaging! "Of note is that in this "historic" document, I got the name of the society wrong since the name we agreed to was The Society of Breast Imaging! (I later corrected my blunder in a subsequent communication). There were 31 other Radiologists who were invited to join this new society. A copy of the actual

We all realized that if the other Radiologists who joined the society did not perceive the need for this new society, or did not share our enthusiasm, our first meeting might also be our last! I am sometimes asked whether someone took a photograph at this April 24th organizational meeting in Boston. The answer is no. I am not really certain that any of us gave much thought to whether such a momentous event deserved pictorial documentation for the future!

1988: HISTORY & MILESTONES

1988 - The first breast imaging controversy which involved SBI occurred. Fearful of losing patients, the American Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeons were formulating a policy statement that by using special views, mammography in patients with augmented breasts was just as sensitive as mammography in patients with non-augmented breasts. Members of the SBI disagreed with this and communications between both societies ensued. To the displeasure of the surgeons, the SBI formulated a policy statement that mammography, even with special views such as implant displaced views, was not as sensitive in the augmented breast as in the non-augmented breast. This policy appeared in the American Journal of Roentgenology (AJR 153:1098-1099, 1989 Hall FM, Homer MJ, D'Orsi CJ, Eklund, GW). This foreshadowed what was the first of many disputes and controversies in the field of Breast Imaging, where the SBI served as the voice of Radiology.







Welcome to the Society of Breast Imaging (SBI)! The organizational meeting of the SBI was held in Boston, Massachusetts on April 24, 1985. The six founding radiologists were Carl D'Orsi, Stephen Feig, Marc Homer, Harold Moskowitz. Myron Moskowitz and Edward Sickles. The objectives of the SBI, as listed in the articles of organization, are to: 1. improve and disseminate knowledge in the field of breast imaging, 2. improve the quality of

Homer, who served in this capacity for four consecutive terms, from 1985 to 1988. He was followed by Carl D'Orsi (1989), Edward Sickles (1990), Valerie Jackson (1991-1992), and Lawrence Bassett (1993-1994).

Initially, membership in the Society was limited to Fellows and was by invitation, with membership based on contributions to the field of breast imaging. From 1985 to 1990 the Society grew to 75 active fellows. In 1991, a general membership category was established. Requirements for general membership are certification by the American Board of Radiology or American Osteopathic Board of Radiology and an active interest in breast imaging. The establishment of a general membership was a natural evolution which provided an opportunity for the Society to increase its influence and effectiveness in scientific. professional and political interactions, as well as in educational activities. MemInformation about the requirements for induction as a Fellow of the Society are included in this newsletter.

Prior to 1993, the Fellows of the Society had scheduled their meetings to coincide with the Annual Meeting of the Radiological Society of North America. The SBI held its first postgraduate course at Amelia Island, Florida in 1993. The course was a phenomenal success, attracting over 600 attendees. Valerie Jackson has written a separate report on the postgraduate course in this newsletter. At the postgraduate course, the **Executive Committee of the** Society agreed that it would be important to establish a newsletter as a vehicle to inform the membership about Society activities and important issues in breast imaging. Gilda Cardenosa, M.D. from the Susan G. Komen Breast Center in Peoria, Illinois was the unanimous choice to be the editor in chief of the newsletter.

The Society is now dealing with several membership issues, including a request by physicists for membership, and the desire of radiologic technologists to establish an affiliated parallel society. We are also exploring potential relationships with international societies. Future projects include sponsoring research and scholarships in breast imaging, new postgraduate courses, and the establishment of a forum for presentation of original investigations in breast imaging. Now and in the future, members of this Society will join together to have a united voice in the issues of screening guidelines, regulatory legislation, inspections of facilities, health care reform and the future direction of breast imaging.

SBI Position on 2009 USPSTF Guidelines 2009: IMPACT

November 16: United States Preventative Services Task Force issues new breast screening guidelines

- No routine screening for women 49 years of age or younger
- Biennial screening for women ages 50-74
- No routine screening for women 75 years or older

The SBI executive committee unanimously decides to strongly oppose these recommendations along with the ACR and the ACS.

This shift will allow for more members to participate in leadership opportunities within the society including serving as Committee Chairs, Society Representatives and more.





Society of Breast Imaging Statement on Breast Imaging during the COVID-19 Pandemic

The Society of Breast Imaging's core purpose is "to save lives and minimize the impact of breast cancer." To fulfill that purpose, the SBI strongly advocates for routine annual screening mammography for all women starting at age 40 because the data clearly show this is the best approach to minimizing the mortality due to breast cancer. However, the outbreak of a disease due to a novel strain of coronavirus, COVID-19, raises the difficult question of whether we can provide appropriate screening while also minimizing the impact of this pandemic to our communities.

Many of our members have voiced concern that providing routine care for asymptomatic women who may be unknowing carriers of COVID-19 places others at risk. Women seeking ongoing care for breast cancer may be immunocompromised and therefore at increased risk of contracting COVID-19 and developing a severe form of the disease. Others at potential risk include otherwise healthy patients who share waiting areas, restrooms, elevators, and handrails with those unknowingly carrying the disease. Our breast imaging technologists are also at risk, particularly given the very close person-to-person contact required to adequately position patients for high-quality imaging. Finally, maintaining full patient schedules places physicians at risk of contracting the illness. Once exposed or infected, these radiologists may not be available to care for women with more urgent breast imaging needs.

SBI recommends that individual facilities delay screening breast imaging exams for several weeks or a few months. Furthermore, diagnostic studies on women without a clinically concerning symptom, such as patients with six month follow-up, should also be delayed. The advisability of delay will depend in part on the presence of active or suspected disease in the community and the ability of a facility to mitigate risk. Once the pandemic has abated and the risk to our patients, our healthcare colleagues and the community has lessened, we would urge all facilities to redouble efforts to complete all delayed screening as expeditiously as possible.


Transitions 2023

SBI became an official employer in September 2023 with 6 full-time employees. SBI moved its headquarters to Richmond, VA.






