Leadership Awards Case Study Quality Criteria

To be qualified for a juried award and/or added to the SPLC Member Case Study Library, a case study must:

- Exemplify one or more of SPLC's Principles for Leadership in Sustainable Purchasing
 - Understanding. Understanding the relevant environmental, social, and economic impacts of its purchasing.
 - Commitment. Taking responsibility for the relevant impacts of its purchasing by committing to an action plan.
 - Results. Delivering on its commitment to improve the relevant impacts of its purchasing.
 - Innovation. Actively promoting internal and external innovation that advances a
 positive future.
 - Transparency. Soliciting and disclosing information that supports a marketplace of innovation.
- Document results in terms of environmental, social, and economic performance of purchasing
- Tell a complete story (from start to finish, including lessons learned) of a coherent set of activities that led to those results
- Describe specific strategies that were used, including how they were chosen and how they worked in practice
- Use the provided SPLC Case Study Template to sequence and format the case study submission
- [For Suppliers and Public Interest Advocates] Demonstrate how the activities described enabled a specific purchasing organization or group of organizations to measurably improve the environmental, social, and economic performance of their procurement.
