The TNSAE CAE Scholarship Program is designed to assist association professionals in earning the American Society of Association Executives (ASAE) **Certified Association Executive (CAE)** credential.

Scholarship recipients may receive **up to \$2,000** in reimbursement to help offset eligible out-of-pocket expenses associated with earning the CAE designation, including the CAE application fee, study course registration, and standard CAE study materials.

The purpose of the scholarship program is to encourage and further develop professionalism among Tennessee association professionals while supporting those pursuing the CAE credential.

## Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must:

- ✓ Be a current member of the Tennessee Society of Association Executives (TNSAE).
- ✓ Be eligible to sit for the CAE examination.

Eligibility generally includes:

- Serving as an association CEO for at least three years; or
- Serving as an association staff professional for at least five years.

For complete eligibility requirements, visit **whatiscae.org**.

✓ Take the CAE examination within one year of being selected as a scholarship recipient.

## Selection Process

Applications must be received by **Wednesday, November 4, 2026**.

Applications will be reviewed by a panel of Certified Association Executives (CAEs).

Scholarship recipient(s) will be recognized during the **Awards of Excellence Luncheon** at the TNSAE Annual Convention on Wednesday, December 2, 2026 (Embassy Suites Franklin Cool Springs).

## Scholarship Award

Recipients may be reimbursed for:

- ASAE CAE application fee
- Standard CAE study materials and books
- Approved CAE study courses (such as Michigan SAE's Online Course or ASAE's CAE Immersion Course)

## Reimbursement Requirements

Recipients must submit:

- A copy of their completed ASAE CAE application
- Proof of payment for eligible expenses
