Preconference: Street Nursing: An Innovative Educational and Practice Model to Address the Complexities of Homelessness

Presented by Oregon Health & Science University School of Nursing, Ashland Campus

Nurses in every specialty care for people experiencing homelessness (PEH), a population with some of the worst health in the country with higher rates of severe mental illness and substance abuse, suicide, and sudden death due to overdose, gastrointestinal disease, infection, and arrhythmias than the sheltered population. Lack of competency in caring for PEH by health care providers exacerbates health disparities for this vulnerable population through perpetuation of culturally accepted stigma. The Street Nursing Team (SNT) is an emerging, innovative faculty practice model that includes clinical and didactic nursing education at the undergraduate and graduate levels that provides care for persons experiencing homelessness (PEH) at multiple readily accessible, intermittent, and regularly scheduled sites in southern Oregon communities. The SNT's specific purpose is to provide culturally-aligned care to PEH in rural and underserved southern Oregon communities by strengthening the capacity of nursing students to manage social determinants of health improve health equity, and deliver quality, unbiased care. The SNT, with validation by national experts for people experiencing homelessness, developed registered nursing key competencies; associated knowledge, skills, and attitudes; and concepts, content, and learning activities to serve as an educational framework in providing care for people experiencing homelessness. This framework has national application for adoption into other faculty practice models and undergraduate nursing curricula to advance health equity for people experiencing homelessness. A toolkit of learning activities to support these competencies will be shared.
