The Future of Nursing 2020-2030: Charting a Path to Health Equity is a landmark report that galvanizes the nursing profession to pursue a shared goal of health equity and suggests that, at four million strong, nurses have a vital role to play in this effort. As educators and schools are redoubling their efforts to support and graduate a diverse and highly competent student body, there is an urgent need to adopt an academic framework to 1) understand the impact of trauma on student learning, 2) ground equity and justice in nursing education, and 3) underpin policy development. Equity-centered Trauma-informed Educational Practice (TIE-P) provides a framework for examining, scrutinizing, and eliminating the influences and impact of racism (including explicit, implicit, systematic, and microaggressions) and inequitable practices in pedagogy, policy, and teaching/academic practices.
